REPORT ON THE SLOVAK AUDIOVISUAL SITUATION IN 2023

> INTRODUCTION

- 2023 was the first post-pandemic year; COVID-19 had not wholly disappeared but did not occur in a high number of cases and became virtually marginal.
- We could say that 2023 was a year of return, a return to normal life. This has
 manifested itself across society and has of course been even more pronounced
 in the audiovisual industry, which is heavily dependent on viewers.
- In 2023, we recorded 47 feature films for cinemas, the second-highest number of films ever in Slovakia (in the previous year 2022, the number was even higher 50 films, but this was a consequence of the pandemic period, due to many producers awaiting releases and distribution in cinemas). Of those 47 films, 31 were feature films, 14 documentaries and 2 were animated. 24 films (51.06%) were directed by debutants, which confirms the thesis that shooting one's first film in Slovakia is not such an insurmountable obstacle. The most expensive film was the historical detective story *We Have Never Been Modern*, with its production costing EUR 3,600,000, and the cheapest was the comedy *Ghosts Won't Ruin My Day*, with a budget of EUR 8,682.
- The genre composition of films is equally varied. There are several dramas in the list of majority films (*Réveillon*, *Power*, *Photophobia*), several comedies (*Invalid*, *We're Going to Team Building*, *Never Say Never*, *You Are the Bad Luck*, *Love*), but also a fairy-tale (*Perinbaba: Two Realms*) or a film with child-actors (Mimi).
- Invalid became the best-attended Slovak film with 208,164 viewers, the top two being the American megahits *Barbie* and *Oppenheimer*.
- Several films were featured at prestigious world festivals and some have also received high awards (Mimi the Grand Prix in the Generation Kplus section at the Berlinale, *Photophobia* the Label Europa Cinemas in Venice).
- In the field of documentary film, we recorded 14 feature-length documentaries, 10 of which were majority Slovak. Several of them were released at international festivals (Notes from Eremocene at the Berlinale, A Happy Man at HotDocs Toronto).
- Almost all the films were supported under one of the Audiovisual Fund calls, and more than a third in co-productions with RTVS; both institutions form the funding basis for Slovak audiovision. Co-production deposits constitute the third pillar (16 feature films were made in minority co-productions); mostly Czech companies were co-producers, which of course is natural.

- In the area of cinema distribution, the most important question was whether viewers would continue to return to cinemas and how their habits would change as they became more used to watching films at home during the pandemic. The answer is positive: the recovery rate increased to 78%. In 2023, 5,017,476 viewers attended Slovak cinemas, 15.74% more than in 2022. The total gross box office takings grew by 23.65% year-on-year to a record EUR 34,602,369, which is a result of the increased admission fee (the average price was EUR 6.90), the number of screenings (200,627) and the number of films on offer (870 films, of which 321 were premiéres in effect, this means that almost every day a film was premiéred in Slovak cinemas!).
- The number of cinemas has also increased (176 cinemas with 295 screens, in 2022, it was 158 cinemas with 271 screens).
- Under the MEDIA sub-programme, we recorded a record amount of total support of EUR 2,063,415.56 in 2023. Slovak production companies were particularly successful in the support scheme 'European Mini-slate Development'; 4 Slovak companies received a total of EUR 565,000 in it and in the call 'Development of European co-productions' (3 Slovak companies supported); after a long time, one company was again successful in the call supporting the development of video games and immersive content.
- Finally, one more, somewhat nostalgic fact: the last video rental company ceased operations.
- 2023 reconfirmed that Slovak cinematography is a standard European cinematography with a sufficient number of high-quality creators able to make films of the highest artistic level as well as films which are successful with the audiences, Slovak companies are able to compete with European companies in support programmes such as MEDIA or Eurimages. The whole Slovak audiovisual sector is a finely balanced ecosystem that has been decades in its creation, and much effort has gone into that creation.
 So, let's not do anything to ruin it.

> LEGISLATION

- Section 5(1) of Act no 13/1993 on Artistic Funds, as amended ('the Artistic Funds Act'), laid down, with effect from 30 June 2023, an obligation for recipients of royalties and remuneration of performers (reproductive artists) to pay to the Literary Fund, the Music Fund and the Fine Arts Fund ('the Funds'), subject to the exceptions provided for in that provision, a contribution of 2 % of their gross income. With effect from 1 July 2023, the obligation in question was abolished.
- As set out in Section 3(3) of the Artistic Funds Act: "The sources of income of the Funds shall also be contributions from the recipients of royalties and of the remuneration of performers (reproductive artists) voluntarily paid by those beneficiaries from remuneration for the creation or use of works or performances, if they are income other than from employment under special legislation; the funds shall receive those voluntary contributions according to the creative sectors in the fields referred to in Section 1(1). The contribution voluntarily paid to the funds pursuant to the first sentence shall be tax expenditure in accordance with special legislation." Currently, contributions from the beneficiaries of copyright remuneration and performer (reproductive artists) remunerations are paid to the Funds on a voluntary basis.
- In 2023, on a proposal from the Commission for the Protection of Minors, the Ministry of Culture of the Slovak Republic ('Ministry of Culture') issued a decree setting out the details of the uniform labelling system and how it is to be applied. Decree no 328/2023 of the Ministry of Culture of the Slovak Republic on a Uniform Labelling System and How It Is to Be Applied ('Decree on a Uniform Labelling System') was adopted in order to protect minors from inappropriate media content. On the basis of the Decree on a Uniform Labelling System, an audiovisual work, multimedia work, television service programme and on-demand audiovisual media service programme ('labelled communication') is classified with a descriptor of the type of potentially harmful content of the uniform labelling system ('content descriptor'). The Decree stipulates the following types of content descriptors: violence, discrimination, fear, addiction, sex, vulgarisms and nudity. The introduction of content descriptors alerting to the presence of potentially harmful content should, in particular, improve the awareness of parents, children and others about the content of the labelled communication, for example in the form of a film, a series, a computer game, etc.
- The Decree lays down, for each type of content descriptor, the conditions under which a labelled communication is to be classified as unsuitable for the age group of minors under 7 years, 12, 15 or 18. When classifying, the content of the labelled communication shall be assessed from the view-point of the contextual occurrence of the assessment criteria for unsuitability in the labelled communication, the manner and form of processing or displaying the individual assessment criteria for unsuitability, having regard to the nature and type of the communication and its artistic, satirical and moral message, the intensity and

- frequency of the occurrence of the assessment criteria for unsuitability in the labelled communication and the previous classification of the labelled communication according to another accepted labelling scheme. The Uniform Labelling System Decree entered into force on 1 January 2024.
- In 2023, on a proposal from the Commission for the Protection of Minors, the Ministry of Culture also issued *Decree no 78/2023 of the Ministry of Culture of the Slovak Republic on Accepted Labelling Schemes* ('Decree on Accepted Labelling Schemes'). On the basis of the Decree in question, the Pan-European Game Information is an accepted labelling system. The multimedia work may be determined by the age-suitability and type of potentially harmful content according to the Pan-European Game Information content assessment system, in accordance with its code of conduct. The Decree on Accepted Labelling Schemes entered into force on 1 April 2023.
- In addition to the above, in 2023, the Ministry of Culture also issued Decree no 318/2023 of the Ministry of Culture of the Slovak Republic on Subtitles for Hearing-Impaired Persons ('Decree on Subtitles for Hearing-Impaired Persons'). The purpose of the Decree at issue was to introduce legislation laying down requirements on subtitles for hearing-impaired persons accompanying audiovisual works, television service programmes and on-demand audiovisual media service programmes, which, as a result, will harmonise the practices of subtitle producers and improve the quality of subtitles for hearing-impaired persons.
- The Decree on Subtitles for Hearing-Impaired Persons regulates the technical requirements for subtitles for hearing-impaired persons, how to ensure synchronisation with the audio track while allowing adequate time for reading subtitles, the distinction between subtitles, the rules for subtitling if there is a text in a foreign language in an audiovisual work or programme, when and how it is possible to modify the subtitle text against verbatim speaking, the communication of sounds and Foley sounds in subtitles, and the modification of subtitles to live programmes. The Decree in question entered into force on 1 January 2024.

FILM EDUCATION

- The youngest generation have the opportunity to develop their creative potential at a number of schools: at **L'udovít Rajter's Elementary School of Art** (www.zussklenarova.sk), **Ján Albrecht's Elementary School of Art** (www.zusjanalbrechta.eu), the **Private Secondary Art School of Animation** (www.uat.sk) in Bratislava – this school also offers higher technical education in the fields of Animation and Film and Media Production, the **Primary School of Art** on Irkutská Street in Košice (www.zusirkutska.sk), the **Private Elementary School of Art DAMA** (www.szusdama.sk) in Prešov, the **Private Secondary School of Film Art** (www.filmovaskola.sk) in Košice and the **Secondary School of Scenic Graphic Arts** (www.zsssvba.sk) in Bratislava which also offers higher technical education in Film and Media Production and Animation. The **School of Art** in Trenčín

(www.suptn.sk) and the **Private Secondary School of Art** in Zvolen (www.ssuszv.sk) offer courses in animation and **Bohumil Bača's Private School of Art** (www.skoladesignu.sk) in Bratislava offers a three-year higher technical education course in Film and Media Production and Animation and a four-year course with a school-leaving examination in Animation and Film Production.

- Although there are several university-level schools of art in Slovakia, to date the teaching of audiovisual art in them has been only marginal for instance, the Faculty of Mass Media Communications at the University of Ss. Cyril and Methodius in Trnava (https://fmk.sk), the Department of Photography and New Media at the Academy of Fine Arts in Bratislava (www.vsvu.sk) and the Department of Fine Arts and Intermedia at the Faculty of Arts of the Technical University (www.fu.tuke.sk) in Košice. The Academy of Film and Multimedia (http://vsftam.sk) in Bratislava offers a non-accredited but certified educational programme which does not replace the Bachelor's Degree course and does not confer an academic title, although its graduates are competent in resolving practical animation, graphical-artistic tasks in the film, advertising and designing industries.
- Students of the **Academy of Arts in Banská Bystrica** can study audiovisual production at two faculties. The **Faculty of Fine Arts** (fvu.aku.sk) has the Department of Intermedia, Digital Media and Spatial Production. Students can take courses in Film and Television Directing and Screenwriting focused on Documentary Production and on Screenwriting and Dramaturgy and Acting at the **Faculty of Dramatic Arts** (fdu.aku.sk). **Ass. Prof. Mgr. art. L'ubomír Viluda, ArtD.** is Dean of the Faculty of Dramatic Arts. **Ass. Prof. Mgr. Martin Palúch, PhD.** is Head of the Department of Documentary Film Production. **PhDr. Kateřina Javorská** is Head of the Department of Film Dramaturgy and Screenwriting and **Mgr. art. Barbora Špániková, ArtD.** is Head of the Acting Department.
- As at 31 December 2023, 40 students were studying in the Bachelor's and Master's programmes in Documentary Film Production and 31 students in the Bachelor's and Master's programmes in Film Dramaturgy and Screenwriting. In 2023, students of the Department of Documentary Film Production made 11 graduation films.
- The Scattered Nest (Rozptýlené hniezdo, SK, 2023, dir. Valery Neskaradziany) won the Best Documentary Award at the 27th Student Film Festival Áčko and After the Wedding (Po svadbe, SK, 2022, dir. Matej Kľúčik) won the Best Documentary Award at the 10th Student International Film Festival in Rijeka, Croatia.
- However, the **Film and Television Faculty of the Academy of Performing Arts** (www.vsmu.sk, "FTF VŠMU") in Bratislava continues to be responsible for the greater part of the preparation of new filmmakers and producers.

FTF VŠMU is a member of the International Association of Film and Television Schools of all the world, **CILECT**, and also its European section, **GEECT**. Prof. Darina Smržová has been Dean of FTF VŠMU since June 2018.

- In 2023, VŠMU and FTF joined the European University Alliance, **FILMEU+** (www.filmeu.eu). It is the first joint supported project of partner schools from Belgium, Portugal, Estonia and Ireland, which formed the original Alliance. In addition to FTF VŠMU, film schools from Bulgaria, Lithuania and Denmark also joined. It is all about linking diverse film traditions, schools and orientations, which have come together in a unique alliance to create new horizons and fundamentally influence the direction of European film schools.
- In the field of **Art**, teaching takes place in the full-time **Bachelor's (Bc.)** and full-time **Master's (Mgr.)** degree in four study programmes:

- In the field of <u>Art and Culture Science</u> teaching takes place in the full-time Bachelor's (Bc.) and full-time Master's (Mgr.) degree in the Theatre, Film and Music Theory study programme guaranteed by:
- Film Studies Department (Head: Mgr. art. Zuzana Mojžišová, PhD.). In the **post-graduate study degree** teaching takes place in 2 study programmes:
- in the field of Art Film Art and Multimedia (ArtD.);
- in the field of <u>Art and Culture Science</u> Theatre, Film and Music Theory (PhD.) guaranteed at FTF VŠMU by the Film Studies Department (Head: Mgr. art. Zuzana Mojžišová, PhD.).
- In 2023, the excellent scientific teams under the auspices of the Slovak Ministry of Education, Science, Research and Sport, led by Professors Martin Šulik and Ľudovít Labík, which were operational in 2015-2022, completed their work.

- As at 31 December 2023, there were 282 students at FTF VŠMU, of whom 27 were foreign students. There were 181 students in the Bachelor's (of whom 21 were foreign students) and 101 in the Master's programmes (of whom 6 were foreign students). Together with 6 full-time and 14 external post-graduate students, there were 302 students at FTF VŠMU.
- In the 2022/2023 academic year, 96 students graduated from FTF VSMU (of whom 5 were foreign graduates): 56 Bachelors (of whom 5 were foreign graduates) and 40 Masters (of whom none were foreign graduates). In addition, 4 full-time post-graduate students and 1 external post-graduate student graduated all of them Slovak.
- In 2023, FTF VŠMU also co-organised a number of workshops, masterclasses and series of lectures, such as Áčko Festival, Film Language Summer School, Script Pitching Forum (Screenwriter's Day), Sweet 16 workshop, Editing Masterclass, Student Confrontation, CEE ANIMATION, 360° Camera project, IVGC conference VFX and HD; it participated in the Visegrad Film Forum and other events.
- The 27th Student Film Festival Áčko (https://festivalacko.sk/) was held on 19 22 October on the premises of FTF VŠMU. In 2023, its organisers decided to present not only the films of their students but also others to the audience and thus began collaborations with the Academy of Arts in Banská Bystrica, the Krzysztof Kieślowski Film School at the University of Silesia in Katowice, and the University of Theatre and Film Art in Budapest.
- This Peculiar Day (Tento divný deň, SK, 2023, dir. Emília Ondriašová) became the Best Film a psychological drama of a forty-something man who deals with the bleakness of his own life. Emília Ondriášová also won the Best Editing Award and, together with Pavol Babej, also the Best Screenplay Award. The Scattered Nest (Rozptýlené hniezdo, SK, 2023, dir. Valery Neskaradziany) became the Best Documentary. Monika Mahútová won the Best Feature Film Directing Award for Standing Still (Nablízku, SK, 2022). Flexin (Na Výchyr, SK, 2023, dir. Samuel Púchovský) became the Best Animation, Lenka Špániková won the Best Cinematography Award for The Whisper of Freedom (Posledná šanca, SK, 2023, dir. Anna Ahaliieva). Marián Valovič, Patrik Maryniak and Maroš Seidmann impressed with Best Visual Effects in Aether (Aether, SK, 2023, dir. Marián Valovič), Pavol Guman won the Best Sound Award for Rave to the Grave (O mŕtvych len v dobrom, SK, 2022, dir. Vladimír Horník) and the Jury Award went to A Sea to Remember (Iluze, rod mužský, SK, 2023, dir. Radek Ševčík).
- Films made by FTF VŠMU students in 2023 were screened at 96 festivals, showcases and screenings, predominantly in Europe but also in Africa, Australia, Asia, USA, Canada and South American countries.
- In 2023, films made by FTF students won 21 awards altogether 7 abroad and 14 at domestic festivals.

- The feature film **Liquid Bread** (Chlieb náš každodenný, SK, 2021, dir. Alica Bednáriková) was the most successful it was presented at eighteen festivals and showcases and won the Best Short Film Award at the Slow Film Festival in Eger (Hungary), the Student Jury Award at the 5th Blue Danube Film Festival in Vienna (Austria) and the Special Mention in the Short Film Competition at the IFF Art Film Fest Košice.
- **Rave to the Grave** (O mŕtvych len v dobrom, SK, 2022, dir. Vladimír Horník) won the Special Mention in the Zlín Dog Student Film Competition at the 63rd International Film Festival for Children and Youth in Zlín (Czech Republic).
- Two films were shortlisted at the 76th Yugo BAFTA Student Awards 2023, Los Angeles (California, USA) I Don't Want to Go Yet (Ja ešte nechcem odísť, SK, 2022, dir. Klára Fedora Homzová) and Standing Still (Nablízku, SK, 2022, dir. Monika Mahútová). Poisoned Well (Otrávená studňa, SK, 2023, dir. Radek Ševčík) won the Special Award for Best Film at the 20th International Film and Television Festival "SIMFEST" in Mures (Romania).
- Film science students at FTF VŠMU prepare the **Frame** magazine which was part of the professionally reviewed journal for science on film and moving images **Kino-Ikon** from 2003 to 2020. It has been solely published in electronic form on the Internet since 2021 (https://kas.vsmu.sk/projekty/frame/).
- FTF VŠMU also operated the KLAP Cinema which has been digitised by D-Cinema technology, with a 4K projector and Dolby Atmos sound processor provided from their own resources; however, in 2022 and 2023, no commercial projections open to the public were presented in the cinema.
- Teachers of the Faculty have successfully taken advantage of various grant schemes for ensuring film production and professional events; every year these grants make possible the implementation of projects of several tens to hundreds of thousands of euros. The projects are aimed at promoting art and art science education.
- FTF VŠMU acquired a total of EUR 97,799 from domestic support schemes.
- The Faculty obtained most funds from the Audiovisual Fund (AVF) which supported 15 projects with EUR 61,900 in total. The Faculty also obtained EUR 20,399 from the Cultural and Education Grant Agency of the Ministry of Education, Science, Research and Sport (KEGA), and the Tatrabanka Foundation supported the production of 9 student films in the Art Category with EUR 15,500.
- In 2022, VŠMU decided to create the so-called Internal Grant Scheme (not from external sources). In 2023, three projects were supported for FTF with a total amount of EUR 8,420: Ass. Prof. Katarína Mišíková, PhD. IDENTITY Post-graduate Seminar (EUR 2,020); Mgr. art. Rastislav Boroš, ArtD. Between Theatre and Film (EUR 4,000) and Prof. Ľudovít Labík, ArtD. White Night Videomapping (EUR 2,400).

- In 2023, the publication activities of FTF VŠMU continued. The following books were published: Zuzana Gindl-Tatárová: Practical Dramaturgy (in English, 3rd edition, 145 pages), Marek Leščák, Martin Šulík: Discussions about Movie (in English, 233 pages), Ingrid Mayerová: Five Reflections on Documentary Film (Päť úvah o dokumentárnom filme, 204 pages), Martin Kaňuch (ed.): Jelena Paštéková Between Literature and Film (Jelena Paštéková medzi literatúrou a filmom, VŠMU, SFI, SAPA, 104 pages) and six e-books: Ľudovít Labík: IVGC 2023 Transformations of Visual Effects IV (in English, 85 pages), Jana Keeble: Introduction to Film Art (in English, 142 pages), collection Jánošík, the Story of Lost Film (in English, 48 pages), Marek Leščák, Martin Šulík: Discussions about Movie (in English, 236 pages), Jana Keeble: Introduction to Film Art (Úvod do filmového umenia), Collection of Lectures for Erasmus+ Students (132 pages).
- In 2023, the 18th International Animated Film Festival of Secondary Schools Animofest and the 8th UAT FILM, the International Festival of Feature Films by Secondary School Students were held. Both festivals were organised by the Private Secondary Art School of Animation in Bratislava.
- Ján Albrecht's Elementary School of Art is the organiser of the national competition in audiovisual and multimedia creation of children and youth, **Golden Clapperboard**, in which awards were presented for the eleventh time in 2023. The main prize, the Prize of the Minister of Education, Science, Research and Sport, was awarded to the documentary **Shrovetide**, **Pentecost** (Fašiangy, Turíce, SK, 2022) prepared by the collective of students from the Elementary School of Art Istrijská in Bratislava.

> FILM PRODUCTION

- The growing number of **Slovak full-length films produced for cinema** peaked in 2022 when it achieved a **record 50 films**. In 2023, three fewer were made, i.e. 47 but this still represents twice as many as the average for 2010-2017.

- There were 31 feature, 14 documentaries and two animated films among them. Twenty-four full-length films (52.3%) were directed by débuting filmmakers (see the table on pp. 12–18).
- Twelve films (26.1%) were directed by women, and one was directed by a man and woman. Women had a part in the production of 24 films (52.3%).
- We Have Never Been Modern (Úsvit, SK/CZ, 2023, dir. Matej Chlupáček) with a budget of EUR 3,600,000 was the most expensive project and Ghosts Won't Ruin My Day (Duchovia mi nepokazia deň, SK, 2023, dir. Peter Čermák) with a budget of EUR 8,682 was the cheapest feature film.
- Of the 31 feature films (28 in 2022), fourteen were 100% Slovak or majority co-productions:
- Réveillon (A máme, čo sme chceli, SK/CA, 2023, dir. Michal Kunes Kováč)
 a film set during the 1992 New Year's Eve celebrations, when not only Czechoslovakia was divided, but also one particular family;
- **Ghosts Won't Ruin My Day** (Duchovia mi nepokazia deň, SK, 2023, dir. Peter Čermák) a comedy in which a married couple must come to terms with living with a pair of twin ghosts;
- the most successful domestic film of 2023, a black comedy about a vengeful wheelchair user, a Roma man in a Nazi uniform and a couple of crooks from the 1990s, **Invalid** (Invalid, SK, 2023, dir. Jonáš Karásek);
- **We're Going to Team Building** (Jedeme na teambuilding, SK/CZ, 2023, dir. Zuzana Marianková) a successful comedy about employees of a multinational company who go on a teambuilding trip;
- **She Hero** (Mimi, SK, 2023, dir. Mira Fornay) film-parable with child protagonists; this was awarded the Grand Prix in the Generation Kplus section at the Berlinale;
- **Power** (Moc, SK/HU/CZ, 2023, dir. Mátyás Prikler) a drama dealing with the theme of the workings of political power, but also the possibilities of seeking and hiding the truth;
- **Never Say Never** (Nikdy nehovor nikdy, SK/CZ, 2023, dir. Branislav Mišík) a family comedy about a man and a woman whose marriages are falling apart and whose budding relationship is also made complicated by their four children and yoga classes;
- **Perinbaba: Two Realms** (Perinbaba a dva svety, SK/CZ, 2023, dir. Juraj Jakubisko) a loose sequel to Jakubisko's cult fairy-tale **Lady Winter** (Perinbaba, CS/DE/IT/AT, 1985), in which the one and only Perinbaba the Italian actress Giulietta Masina was "brought to life" with the help of CGI:

- **You Are the Bad Luck, Love** (Smolu nosíš ty, láska, SK, 2023, dir. Samuel Spišák) a romantic comedy about two people of mature age looking for a place and a way of life after becoming fifty years old:
- **Photophobia** (Svetloplachosť, SK/CZ/UA, 2023, dir. Ivan Ostrochovský, Pavol Pekarčík) a film about people who sheltered from the war at the Heroes of Labour station in the Kharkiv subway;
- the comedy **As Bad As It Gets** (Tak zle, ako sa len dá, SK, 2023, dir. Viktor Csudai) takes a look at love relationships through five stories of five couples on park benches;
- We Have Never Been Modern (Úsvit, SK/CZ, 2023, dir. Matej Chlupáček) a historical crime drama set in 1937 in the town of Svit beneath the Tatras; a comedy about first love and the last burglary Villa Lucia (Villa Lucia, SK/CZ, 2023, dir. Michal Kollár); and Zenith (Zenit, SK/HU/CZ, 2023, dir. György Kristóf) which uses dance as a language to illustrate the power dynamics that has shaped the political landscape in recent decades, not only in Europe but also around the world.
- And seventeen feature films (14 in 2022) were made in minority co-production:
- #annaismissing (#annaismissing, CZ/SK, 2023, dir. Pavel Soukup) a film dealing with topics such as sharenting, i.e. the overuse of social media by parents and the sharing of content related to their children, or the power of influencers, as well as issues outside of the internet that the internet is accelerating;
- **Restore Point** (Bod obnovy, CZ/PL/SK/RS, 2023, dir. Robert Hloz) a crime sci-fi thriller combining the detective story genre with questions of how the development of technology will affect our lives and how it will change our civilisation;
- **Brothers** (Bratři, CZ/DE/SK, 2023, dir. Tomáš Mašín) an adventurous historical drama about the resistance group of brothers Josef and Ctirad Mašín;
- the drama **Brutal Heat** (Brutální vedro, CZ/SK, 2023, dir. Albert Hospodářský) set in a world threatened by a solar fragment flying towards Earth, in which an eighteen-year-old boy faces unexpected and unpleasant challenges;
- **A Sensitive Person** (Citlivý člověk, CZ/SK, 2023, dir. Tomáš Klein) based on the book by Jáchym Topol, the film follows the gradual transformation of a father-son relationship amidst a crazy world;
- Kaytek the Wizard (Kajtek czarodziej, PL/SK/CZ, dir. Magdalena Łazarkiewicz) a story with fantasy elements which transports the viewer into the world of children's first encounters with reality at a time when the most tragic war cataclysm of the last century is about to take place;
- **Snake Gas** (Hadí plyn, CZ/SK, 2023, dir. David Jařab) an adventure road movie based on Joseph Conrad's novel Heart of Darkness, reflecting on colonialism, the clash of cultures, the plundering of nature and coming to terms with our dark sides:
- Her Body (Její tělo, CZ/SK, dir. Natálie Císařovská) a film inspired by the true story of Andrea Absolonová, who was one of the most successful Czech female high divers in the 1990s and later became a well-known and successful porn actress under the pseudonym Lea De Mae;

- **Kálmán's Day** (Kálmán-nap, HU/SK/US, 2023, dir. Szabolcs Hajdu) a drama about crumbling and ending relationships, in which the main character is portrayed by the director himself;
- **Neither With You** (Lítá v tom, CZ/SK, 2023, dir. Tomáš Dianiška) a romantic comedy about what can happen when you get caught up in one innocent lie;
- **Mr. and Mrs. Stodola** (Manželé Stodolovi, CZ/SK, dir. Petr Hátle) a film about a married couple who murdered eight pensioners in 2001 and 2002;
- **Solitude** (IS/SK, 2023, dir. Ninna Pálmadóttir) the story of a farmer who is forced to trade his farm for life in the city, a curious boy named Ari, and their extraordinary friendship;
- the drama **Stepne** (Stepne, UA/DE/PL/SK, 2023, dir. Maryna Vroda) follows a few days in the life of a man who comes to a small Ukrainian village to take care of his dying mother;
- Waltzing Matylda (Tancuj Matyldo, CZ/SK, 2023, dir. Petr Slavík) the story
 of a successful lawyer whose orderly life with his wife and son is turned upside
 down by his mother's Alzheimer's diagnosis;
- **I Don't Love You Anymore** (Už tě nemám rád, CZ/SK/RO, 2023, dir. Zdeněk Jiráský) the story of two teenagers who decide to escape their parents, their boring life and experience an adventure on the cusp of adulthood;
- **An Explanation for Everything** (Magyarázat mindenre, HU/SK, 2023, dir. Gábor Reisz) the film reflecting on the polarisation and tensions in Hungarian society; this won the main prize in the Horizons section at the Venice Film Festival;
- drama **Calm in the Canopy** (Noční klid, CZ/SK, 2023, r. Michal Hogenauer).
- In 2023, also **fourteen feature-length documentaries for cinema** were made (20 in 2022). Ten of them were **100% Slovak or majority co-productions**:

Jana Durajová, Lena Kušnieriková) a time-lapse documentary that, from 2012 onwards, follows not only the gradual devastation of gallery spaces, but especially the struggle with changing Ministers of Culture, a lack of funding, authorities and contractors;
- **Truth Is All There Is** (Pravda je to najdôležitejšie, SK, 2023, dir. Maroš Brázda) a film about the life and work of director, screenwriter and poet, Eduard Grečner;
- **A Happy Man** (Šťastný človek, SK/CZ, 2023, dir. Soňa G. Lutherová) a film that uses the story of a transgender man, Marvin, and his family to find answers to questions about the functioning of interpersonal relationships and a happy life;

a documentary following the fate of Roma people who have become a minority within a minority because of their physical handicaps or gender identity;

2023) and **Snow** (Sneh, SK, 2023) were made. And also episodes 21–23 of the TV series **The Websters** (Websterovci, dir. Katarína Kerekesová) entitled **The Carnival** (Karneval, SK/SI/CZ, 2023), **Flying to the Moon** (Let na Mesiac, SK/SI/CZ, 2023) and **Saving Struggles** (Šetrí celá rodina, SK/SI/CZ, 2023). Also, the pilot film **I Throw the Furthest!** (Ja hodím najďalej!, SK, 2023, dir. Ivana Laučíková) from the series **Forest Five** (Lesná päťka) was made.

- Radio and Television of Slovakia also had some part in the production of 17 full-length cinema films, i.e. 37.8% of the 2023 production - 7 feature films, 9 documentaries and one animated film. It continues to be the biggest producer in the area of documentary production, whether on its own or in collaboration with independent producers (refer to the chapter on TELEVISION).

SLOVAK AUDIOVISUAL FUND

- The Audiovisual Fund (AVF, www.avf.sk) has provided support since 2010. As an independent public institution established by a separate Act, it is the main source of financial support for audiovision in Slovakia. Its aim is to support all parts of the filmmaking, film production and distribution process, film festivals, education, research, publication activities and technological development, particularly in the area of cinema digitisation. The financial sources of the Fund consist of a contribution from the national budget and contributions from entities which use audiovisual works in their business activities: the broadcaster of the television programme service in the public interest (5% of revenues from advertisements), private television broadcasters (2% of revenues from advertisements), cinemas (1% of the price per ticket sold), distributors of audiovisual works (1% of revenues from distribution outside of cinemas), retransmission operators (1% of retransmission revenues), and operators of the audiovisual on-demand media service (0.5% of revenues for provision of the service).

- The law requires the AVF's support activities to be divided into two independent parts support for audiovisual culture (grants, scholarships and loans) and support for the audiovisual industry (as of 1 January 2020, grants of 33% of non-state funds invested in the Slovak Republic in the production of film projects and works for TV broadcasting). Support for audiovisual culture has been available in the AVF since it was first established; the AVF supported the first project in the audiovisual industry in 2016.
- The national budget contribution allocated at EUR 40.107.425 constituted the basic source of income in the Fund's 2023 budget. On the basis of contract MK - 6/2023/M of 24 January 2023 on the granting of a State contribution from the 2023 national budget concluded between the AVF and the Ministry of Culture of the Slovak Republic ('the contract'), the Ministry of Culture of the Slovak Republic (MC SR) undertook to provide the AVF with a contribution under Section 29(1) of the AVF Act amounting to EUR 6,000,000 for the promotion of audiovisual culture and EUR 6,290,000 to support the audiovisual industry. Under the contract, these funds were credited to the AVF bank account in a single instalment totalling EUR 12,290,000 on 27 January 2023. One amendment was made to the contract. By Amendment no. 1 to the contract of 28 September 2023, the contribution for the promotion of audiovisual culture was increased by EUR 6,000,000 and the contribution to support the audiovisual industry by EUR 21,817,425. The funds were paid into the AVF bank account in accordance with the Addendum on 29 September 2023. Thus, the total amount of the contribution received from the 2023 national budget to support audiovisual culture amounted to EUR 12,000,000 and the total amount for support to the audiovisual industry was EUR 28,107,425. Together, the contribution from the national budget to the Fund amounted to EUR 40,107,425 in 2023.
- The detailed breakdown of revenue actually paid from each of the contributors that are not public administration entities (i.e. excluding the contribution from the national budget and the contribution from the public administration organisation RTVS) under the relevant provisions of the Act is as follows, comparing 2022 and 2023:

- The table shows that there has been no significant year-on-year change in the total amount or the structure of contributions.
- However, in the coming years, for the positive development of this category of the Fund's revenues, it will be necessary for the obligation to pay contributions under Section 28a (AVMS operators) to also be linked to operators of these services from abroad and to their revenues generated within the territory of the Slovak Republic. The current legislative situation discriminates against operators registered in the Slovak Republic as opposed to other competitors on the market and thus causes their unequal legal position.
- In 2022, the Fund attained the historically largest total amount of contributions charged by law, which represents 58.0% of the contribution from the national budget for the promotion of audiovisual culture. This share of the Fund's own contributions and the national budget is also exceptional within the international context of countries with an audiovisual area comparable to that in the Slovak Republic.

- Based on the internal budget breakdown for 2023, the Audiovisual Fund's total expenditures were budgeted at EUR 58,332,948; actual expenditures at the end of the accounting period were EUR 24,024,990.
- The first major group of current expenditures for the period under review consisted of expenditures related to the Fund's operational activities and to the comprehensive provision of its support activities.
- The second major group of budgeted current expenditures consisted of current transfers, which were budgeted by the Fund at a total of EUR 57,137,948, whereof EUR 22,651,306 was actually spent during the reporting period, of which EUR 10,059,330 was paid to support audiovisual culture (grants and scholarships provided to applicants for the implementation of supported projects), EUR 12,570,281 was paid to support the audiovisual industry and EUR 21,695 was paid as transfers abroad (statutory levies paid abroad for members of expert committees and the Fund's membership fee in international organisations).

- The results of the Fund's activities and its support activities in standard statistical indicators in 2023 were influenced by the extraordinary rise in input costs in all sectors, and the audiovisual sector was no exception to this. The situation was caused by the remnants of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Russian aggression in Ukraine and the economic retaliatory measures of European Union countries, including the Slovak Republic.
- In September 2023, the Ministry of Culture provided an extraordinary contribution to partially alleviate the situation.
- In independent film production, the anti-pandemic measures also meant an increase in the cost of producing audiovisual works, postponement of deadlines and, finally, postponement of the release of completed projects and their possible economic valuation. This situation deriving from the previous period was reflected, among other things, in the year-on-year increase in the number of Slovak films premiéred in cinemas in the Slovak Republic, with several works postponing their public release until 2023.

- The table shows that, when compared against the trend of an increasing number of premiéred titles over the previous decade, the past year has seen a renewed increase in this statistical indicator above the long-term average.
- The share of minority co-productions in the total number of new Slovak films is increasing; on the one hand, this illustrates the marked openness of the Slo-

vak audiovisual landscape and, on the other hand, its dependence on international cooperation, as the cost of producing films increased significantly during the post-COVID period just like other costs in the national economy, while the fund's revenues from the largest contributor to date remained at 2018 levels.

Due to the slow return of audiences to cinemas and, in particular, as compensation due to the exceptional increase in operating and distribution costs, the Fund also provided increased support for the distribution of audiovisual works in the past year. In Sub-programme 2.1 intended to support the distribution.

tion and presentation of audiovisual works, the Fund distributed an amount that was **historically the second largest total amount of EUR 823,650** in 2023, supporting a total of 80 applications (of which exceptional support to distributors amounted to **EUR 295,455**).

- Support for the audiovisual industry in Programme 5 also recorded an increase in 2023. Within this programme, the Fund granted support amounting to EUR 12,570,281 to 68 projects in total, which represents the historically largest amount since this programme was established (2016).
- In this regard, it is necessary to emphasise that, with effect from 1 January 2020, the conditions of support for the audiovisual industry have been regulated

by legislation and **the original grant rate of 20% of eligible costs was adjusted to 33%**. Due to this, the number of registered film projects increased significantly over the course of 2020 and 2023, and also the total amount of support disbursed to the audiovisual industry increased year-on-year. The Fund **registered a record 100 new film projects** in 2023; these are gradually being implemented or will be implemented in 2023 to 2026.

- In 2023, the Audiovisual Fund provided funds in all areas of its support activities – creation, production and distribution of audiovisual works, festivals and other cultural events in audiovision, presentation and promotion of Slovak audiovisual culture abroad and the participation of Slovak audiovisual works in international events, support for research, education, audiovisual training and publishing activities.
- The breakdown into core programmes is determined by the structure of the Fund's support activities for the relevant period as approved by the Fund's Board. The largest in terms of the volume of funds and the number of applications received and projects supported is **Programme 1**, which is aimed at supporting the creation and production of audiovisual works (sub-programmes for fiction, documentary, animation, school and educational audiovisual works, as well as audiovisual works in which a Slovak co-producer has a minority co-production share).
- Programme 2 is aimed at supporting the public dissemination and presentation of audiovisual works, including support for film festivals and other public

cultural events in audiovision and also including support for the presentation of Slovak audiovisual works at events at home and abroad. In 2023, following an in-depth discussion with distributors and cinema operators, the Fund adjusted the conditions for both the promotion of traffic to Slovak cinematographic works and the distribution of audiovisual works.

- **Programme 3** is aimed at supporting publishing activities, professional research, education and audiovisual training.
- **Programme 4** is predominantly focused on the important area of digitisation and modernisation of cinemas in the Slovak Republic and, since 2016, the Fund also provides support in a new sub-programme aimed at the development of technologies for making audiovisual works in the Slovak Republic and also for projects focused on cinema marketing and audience development.
- Programme 5 focuses on support for the audiovisual industry in accordance with the Act and the subsequent Decree no. 165/2014 of the Ministry of Culture of the Slovak Republic on the Film Project.

- The table shows a **year-on-year increase in the share of programme 2** in 2023 (specific support to distributors and increased support for film distribution), which also caused a partial **change compared with the projected shares**

of the individual programmes in the structure of the Fund's support activity for 2023 (see the right column in the Table). This change was mainly due to a significantly smaller number of applications submitted in Programme 4 than in the initial assumptions.

³ The support is provided to the beneficiary in the financial year concerned only in a partial amount and is subsequently provided by instalments in the form of addenda to the contract over the following years. This procedure is to be applied by the Fund in particular in relation to both financial and implementation-intensive projects in the production of audiovisual works.

Slovak Film Commission

- The Slovak Film Commission (SFC, www.filmcommission.sk) has been a separate organisational unit of the AVF since 2018. The SFC presents film-making opportunities in Slovakia, maps out and mediates film professionals' activities and works, in particular, with foreign producers who want to make films in Slovakia.
- The primary objective of the SFC remains to increase opportunities for nonstate investments in audiovisual production in the Slovak Republic and thus the development of film infrastructure. Investment and job inflows increase the economic competitiveness of rental companies, provide more job opportunities for film professionals, create new job opportunities for recent graduates as well as students in the film and non-film sectors, increase demand for technical film assurance and promotion of Slovakia as a 'film country'.
- Promoting the greening of the film industry for film-making while reducing the environmental burden remains an equally important objective.
- As part of the Audiovisual Fund, the SFC also maintains active membership of international organisations such as the European Film Commissions Network (EUFCN) and the Association of Film Commissioners International (AFCI).
- In 2023, the SFC continued to promote Slovakia as an attractive film location.
- It focused on an active presentation on both domestic and international film markets and events, where the majority took place in person. The SFC participated in selected film markets and festivals, such as the European Film Market in Berlin and the Marché du Film in Cannes.
- A database of filming locations and a production database can be found on the SFC's website. Both serve as the basic information portal when communicating with those interested in making films in Slovakia.
- In addition, the "Made in Slovakia" a summary of foreign films made in Slovakia section has been updated, as well as the **Green Platform** tab which serves as a platform for sustainable film-making for film professionals.
- By means of the SFC, the Slovak Republic has become one of the partner countries of the international Green Screen project (www.interregeurope.eu/greenscreen), focused on the greening of the audiovisual industry.
- In 2023, the SFC successfully accomplished its objectives by active presentation in Slovakia as well as on the international film market.
- The SFC functions as the first point of contact for enquiries about the film infrastructure in Slovakia where foreign filmmakers can obtain compact information in one spot; it is also working intensively towards the establishment of regional film offices in Slovakia.
- The SFC provides information for those interested in making films in Slovakia not only in person at film markets and events, but also in person and electronically. In the course of 2023, the SFC provided advice to some 720 film productions with questions related to shooting in Slovakia and sent around 176 location briefs. Representatives of companies such as Amazon, Constantin Film, Gaumont, Canal+, Orphan Studio, MidAtlantic, Sky Showtime, Zentropa, etc. visited Bratislava and SFC offices in 2023, as a result of building and maintaining contacts with foreign producers.

LITERARY FUND

- The mission of the Literary Fund (LF, www.litfond.sk) is to support the development of artistic, scientific and technical literature, journalistic and creative activities in the areas of theatre, film, radio and television. It did not lose sight of this mission in 2023 when, due to the financial situation related to the abolition of the mandatory 2% contribution, it was obliged to suspend or reduce some forms of its support activities. The 2% contribution from royalties and performing artists' fees constitutes the basis for the creation of the budget for direct support. which is returned in the form of support to creators and artists. Hence, they can significantly affect the financial capacities of the individual LF committees by paying this contribution. In 2023, the Literary Fund's Committee of the Section for Creative Work in Television, Film and Video supported, via the **ALFA Programme**, the production of new, original literary works which could form the basis of feature, documentary and animated films and, via the ALFA PLUS Programme, cinematographic and directing work. The Section Committee also appraised film and television productions made in 2023 and rewarded 13 successful filmmakers via the Igric Awards, Ján Fajnor Awards and Literary Fund Premiums with a total amount of EUR 8,900, and 6 successful Slovak filmmakers with EUR 2,880 at festivals such as IFF Cinematik Piešťany - Cinematic.doc Award (the Literary Fund Award) granted to Soňa Gyarfáš Lutherová for her documentary A Happy Man (Šťastný človek, SK/CZ, 2023); Student Film Festival Áčko - the LF Award granted to Pavol Babej and Emília Ondriašová for Best Screenplay for This Peculiar Day (Tento divný deň, SK, 2023, dir. Emília Ondriašová); and at the Camera 2023 creative competition - the Grand Prix granted to Peter Bencsík for the cinematography of Piargy (Piargy, SK/CZ/MK, 2022, dir. Ivo Trajkov), the Cinematography Awards to Anna Smoroňová for the documentary Icons: Štefan Svetko (Ikony: Štefan Svetko, SK, 2020, dir. Maroš Milčík), to Martin Ontko for the audiovisual commercial Tatra Banka Art of Seeing and to Michal Babinec for the videoclip Califato 34 - Fandagô de Carmen Porter (ES, 2020). Within the Igric Awards, the Literary Fund's Committee of the Section for Radio, Theatre and **Entertainment Arts** also granted awards and premiums in a total amount of **EUR** 3,200.
- In 2023, the Literary Fund's Committee of the Section for Creative Work in Television, Film and Video was obliged to work with a substantially lower budget than in the pre-pandemic years. The Committee provided EUR 63,428 for care for creative staff and artists, whereof more than half of this amount, i.e. EUR 42,800 was disbursed to 53 people in the form of creative scholarships.

MEDIA

- Support for Slovak Entities within the MEDIA Sub-programme in 2023
- 2023 was the first post-pandemic year; all the pandemic measures were finally lifted, so theatres, galleries and concert halls re-opened, concerts were held, including large concerts in stadiums, as well as theatre and film performances. We saw the definitive return of viewers and some attendance numbers were already quite close to 2019, the last year prior to the pandemic; also the proportion of viewers who watched films online and those who went to the cinema has already changed, in favour of live viewers.
- The Creative Europe programme reached the end of the first half of its 2021-2027 programming period, which, in practice, meant that all calls were published and evaluated in a regular rhythm, with very few changes and, when changes were made, they tended to favour the applicants. Applicants adjusted to the new project submission system, based on project management, and the problems initially associated with this system have also gradually decreased.
- Under the MEDIA sub-programme, we recorded the highest ever support of EUR 2,063,415.56; Slovak production companies were very successful and received a total of EUR 565,000 under the two calls of the 'European Mini-slate Development', EUR 191,741.50 under 'European Co-development' and EUR 92,100 under the TV & Online Content scheme. One Slovak applicant received support of EUR 150,000 for a two-year film festival project within the European Festivals scheme and, after long years (the last time in 2006), one Slovak applicant received support under 'Video Games and Immersive Content Development' to the amount of EUR 145,092. Three Slovak companies received a total of EUR 181,517.90 as project partners within the Audience Development and Film Education scheme, six distribution companies EUR 420,683.36 under the automatic support for European Film Distribution and 26 Slovak cinemas in Europa Cinemas received EUR 207,882. It should be stated that all company data and the amount of support for individual projects will become official only after the signature of contracts with EACEA.

EURIMAGES

- Eurimages (www.coe.int/en/web/eurimages), the cinematographic fund of the Council of Europe, is the sole European fund supporting trans-national coproductions of feature-length films. The fund has been operational since 1988 and Slovakia joined it on 15 April 1996. Prof. Zuzana Gindl-Tatárová represents Slovakia in Eurimages. At the end of 2023, Eurimages had 38 Member States out of the total number of 46 countries in the Council of Europe, plus Canada as a full member.
- In 2023, the fund supported 71 feature, 16 documentary and 7 animated feature-length films with a minimal footage of 70 minutes, with a total amount of EUR 26,057,000. From its establishment in 1988 up to 31 December 2023, the fund had supported 2,438 European co-productions to the extent of EUR 694 million.
- In 2023, 14 Slovak projects applied for support from Eurimages, of which 5 were successful:
- The Slovak minority documentary-feature project **Wishing on a Star** directed by Peter Kerekes, which is made in co-production with Italy and minority productions from Austria, the Czech Republic and Croatia, was presented in the following co-production scheme: 47.72% belongs to the Italian company Videomante (delegated producer Erica Barbiani), 25.04% to the Slovak company kerekesfilm (co-producer Peter Kerekes), 10.63% to the Austrian company Mischief Films & Co KG (co-producer Ralph Wieser), 10.61% to the Czech company Artcam Films (co-producer Vít Schmarc) and 6% to the Croatian company Restart (co-producer Vanja Jambrović). The project with a total budget of EUR 805,211 **received support of EUR 75,000**.
- The feature Czech-Slovak co-production project of director Ondřej Provazník It Would Be My Dream with a minority Slovak share is made in the following scheme: 78.68% belongs to Endorfilm s.r.o. (delegated producer Jiří Konečný) and 21.32% belongs to the Slovak company Punkchart films s.r.o. (co-producer Ivan Ostrochovský). The project with a total budget of EUR 1,974,397 was supported with the requested amount of EUR 235,000.


- The feature project **Poberta / Little Thief** directed by Ondřej Hudeček, made in a Czech-Slovak co-production, was presented in a minority scheme for Slovakia: 84.49% is the contribution of Czech production companies nutprodukce s.r.o. (delegated producer Tomáš Hrubý) and MagicLab s.r.o. (co-producer Michal Křeček) and 15.51% belongs to the Slovak company nutprodukcia s.r.o. (co-producer Jakub Viktorin). The project with a total budget of EUR 1,405,256 **received support of EUR 134,000**.
- The triple production **Rok vdovy / Year of the Widow**, a feature film directed by Veronika Lišková with a minority Slovak contribution, is made in the following scheme: 69.75% belongs to the Czech company Cinemotif Films (delegated producer Kristýna Květová), 19.94% is the contribution of the Slovak company kerekesfilm s.r.o. (co-producer Peter Kerekes) and the remaining 10.31% belongs to the Croatian company Pipser (co-producer Miljenka Čogelja). The project with a total budget of EUR 1,038,000 **received the requested support of EUR 240,000**.
- The documentary project **Love Exposed** directed by Filip Remunda, which is made in a Czech-Slovak co-production with a minority Slovak contribution, was presented within the following scheme: 78.95% is the contribution of Czech production companies Hypermarket Film (delegated producer Filip Remunda) together with Freesam s.r.o. (co-producer Alexandr Dlouhý) and 21.05% belongs to the Slovak company kerekesfilm (co-producer Peter Kerekes). The project with a total budget of EUR 403,773 **received the requested amount of EUR 100,000**.
- In 2023, Slovakia's contribution to the fund was EUR 272,373.34.
- In 2023, Slovak co-production projects received EUR 784,000 in total.
- From the date that Slovakia acceded to Eurimages up to 31 December 2023,
 76 projects had received support; in these projects, Slovak production companies functioned as either majority or minority co-producers.

CINEMA DISTRIBUTION

2023 was the first year since 2019 without any epidemiological measures. This has been reflected in admissions and gross turnover, not only in Slovakia but across Europe. Thanks to the recovery rate, i.e. a comparison of admissions for a given year with the average admission in 2017-2019 in percentage terms, we see how we are approaching to pre-Covid cinema admissions. In 2023, Slovakia's recovery rate was 78%. According to preliminary data from the European Audiovisual Observatory (EAO), we share the twentieth rank with Estonia. Georgia and Bosnia and Herzegovina were the only European countries to exceed pre-pandemic admission levels in 2023, by 17.2% and 13.3% respectively.

- In 2023, Turkey achieved the greatest share of domestic films in total admissions (46.3%) followed by France (39.8%). Slovakia was sixth with 14.33%.
- In 2023, 5,017,476 people attended Slovak cinemas for all the films screened, i.e. 15.74% more than in 2022. The top ten films accounted for 34.86% of total admissions (39.3% in 2022) and the top twenty for 49.53% (58.50% in 2022).
- Total gross box office takings increased by 23.65% year-on-year to EUR 34,602,369. The number of screenings increased by 5.45% to 200,627 and thereby exceeded 200,000 for the first time since Slovakia became independent. Average admissions per screening grew from 22.79 in 2022 to 25.01; ho-

wever, this is still the fourth lowest figure since 1993. The **average admission fee** also increased (by 6.83%) to **EUR 6.90**, which is the highest average admission fee since Slovakia became independent.

- In 2023, 870 films were screened in Slovak cinemas (861 in 2022), of which 312 (291 in 2022) were premiéres brought in by 18 distribution companies.
- Barbie (US, 2023, dir. Greta Gerwig) became the best-attended film with 231,710 viewers. Second-ranked was **Oppenheimer** (US, 2023, dir. Christopher Nolan) with 208,790 viewers and third-ranked was a domestic film, the black comedy **Invalid** (Invalid, SK, 2023, dir. Jonáš Karásek) with 208,164 viewers. Another Slovak romantic comedy **Never Say Never** (Nikdy nehovor nikdy, SK/CZ, 2023, dir. Branislav Mišík) was also among the Top 10 films. It ranked eighth with 147,328 viewers. The Ukrainian animated film **Mavka**. **The Forest Song** (Mavka. Lisova pisňa, UA, 2023, dir. Oleh Malamuzh, Olexandra Ruban) was the most successful European title with 68,991 viewers.
- Grand Canyon (Veľký kaňon, SK, 2023, dir. Pavol Barabáš) became the bestattended documentary of 2023 with 4,484 viewers.
- American films again dominated Slovak cinemas in 2023. 67.07% of all viewers went to watch them. The share of European films (excluding Slovak ones) increased from 17.50% in 2022 to 19.92% in 2023. However, the share of domestic films in the admissions (including non-première titles and minority co-productions) increased from 12.74% in 2022 to 14.33% in 2023.
- Last year, all Slovak films, including minority co-productions, were viewed in cinemas by 718,968 viewers (in 2022, this number was 552,409). The number of domestic premiéres was four lower than in 2022. You can find the distribution results of all 44 premiéres of Slovak full-length films in the table on pages 22-23.
- In addition to forty-four full-length films, five short Slovak films were also released in Slovak cinemas and screened prior to the main films: the feature film **Revelation of John** (Zjavenie Jána, SK, 2022, dir. Andrej Kolenčík), the documentary **We Have to Survive: Fukushima!** (Musíme prežiť: Fukušima!, SK, 2022, dir. Tomáš Krupa) and the animated films **Money and Happiness** (RS/SI/SK, 2022, dir. Ana Nedjelković, Nikola Majdak), Criss Cross (Krížom Krážom, SK/CZ, 2023, dir. Nina Rybárová, Tomáš Rybár) and **Blue Teddy Bear** (Plavi medo, HR/SK, 2023, dir. Marina Andree Škop).
- As regards admission figures, according to the Union of Film Distributors of the Slovak Republic (UFD), CinemArt SK was the most successful distribution company. Attendances at its films, 2,420,847, constituted as much as 48.25% of the total admissions. The company was also first in terms of gross box office takings, which amounted to 48.96% of the total box office takings in Slovak cinemas.
- In terms of admissions (17.22%) and gross box office takings (17.02%), the distribution company **Continental film** ranked second. **Bontonfilm** ranked third for both indicators (13.66% viewers and 13.36% gross box office takings).

- The table shows that, **compared with the upward trend in the number of released titles from the previous decade, last year this statistical indicator once more grew above the long-term average.** At the same time, the share of minority co-productions in the total number of new Slovak films remained approxi-

mately the same, which illustrates the marked openness of the Slovak audiovisual environment and its dependence on international collaboration.

The distribution of Slovak films achieved a considerable year-on-year increase on 2022 in all the indicators monitored.

REPORT ON THE SLOVAK AUDIOVISUAL SITUATION IN 2023

- Again, the figures include only the results from the UFD. The 2023 data do
 not include the projections in open-air cinemas where no admission fee is paid,
 the results of festival screenings of non-distribution titles, attendances at the increasingly popular alternative content.
- 2023 was more successful in Slovak cinemas than the previous year based not only on attendance figures but also on gross box office takings. And a glance

at the attendance figures for the first two months of 2024 can fill us with optimism. **The two most successful domestic films have already been viewed by 356,114 people: We're Going to Team Building** (Jedeme na teambuilding, SK/CZ, 2023, dir. Zuzana Marianková) – 242,102, **War of the Police** (Vojna policajtov, SK/CZ, 2024, dir. Rudolf Biermann) – 114,012.

> VIDEO DISTRIBUTION

- According to data from Digital Entertainment Group, **revenues from DVD and Blu-ray sales declined by 25 percent in 2023** and total revenues were USD 1.6 billion. Conversely, **revenues from digital sales** (streaming, rentals and digital copies sales) **increased by almost 20 percent** to over USD 41 billion.
- Despite this, in our own country and abroad, there continues to be interest in films and TV series on physical media. Especially among collectors and fans. As you can see by looking at the charts below, these are often limited editions or expanded versions with bonus material.
- Magic Box Slovakia currently occupies a dominant position on the market; it imports films produced by four of the five American "majors" (Warner, Disney, Universal, Paramount) to the Slovak market and issues its own, mainly domestic, titles. Even in 2023 the company focused primarily on commercially successful films and re-editions of successful older and current sold-out titles.
- In 2023, Magic Box Slovakia issued 310 films on DVD and 75 DVD collections, 124 films on BD and 37 BD collections, 48 UHD titles.

Katarína Kerekesová) and the black comedy Invalid (Invalid, SK, 2023, dir. Jonáš Karásek).
- K2 Studio released Grand Canyon (Veľký kaňon, SK, 2023, dir. Pavol Barabáš) about navigating the rapids of the Colorado River as the 36th title of their Grand Prix edition.

Slovak Films on Blu-ray

- In 2023, the number of Slovak films released on domestic Blu-ray discs increased to seven. Five were released by the Slovak Film Institute as part of a six Blu-ray collection on the occasion of the 60th anniversary of the Slovak Film Institute. (These will be complemented in 2024 by **Pictures of the Old World** (Obrazy starého sveta, CS, 1972) directed by Dušan Hanák.)
- They were digitally restored films Peter Solan's war drama The Boxer and Death (Boxer a smrt, CS, 1962), Juraj Jakubisko's full-length directing début The Prime of Life (Kristove roky, CS, 1967), The Organ (Organ, CS, 1964, dir. Štefan Uher) a dramatic story set in the Slovak Republic during WW2, Stanislav Barabáš's début The Song of the Grey Pigeon (Pieseň o sivom holubovi, CS, 1961) Martin Hollý's psychological drama A Case for the Defence Attorney (Prípad pre obhajcu, CS, 1964).
- The remaining two films were released on Blu-ray by Magic Box Slovakia.
 Jonáš Karásek's black comedy Invalid (Invalid, SK, 2023) and the historical music drama about composer Josef Mysliveček The Bohemian (II Boemo, CZ/IT/SK, 2022, dir. Petr Václav).
- The Blu-ray issue of the break-through Slovak film **The Sun in a Net** (Slnko v sieti, CS, 1962) directed by Štefan Uher, released by the Slovak Film Institute (SFI) on the occasion of the 60th anniversary of the film's making won in the **Best Single Release** category at the **II Cinema Ritrovato DVD Awards 2023** in Bologna, Italy. It is a comprehensive award for the entire Blu-ray issue including the film, bonus material and the overall design.

DVD

- Fermata released a box entitled 2 Films by Jiří Havelka (2 filmy Jiřího Havelky). It includes The Owners (Vlastníci, CZ/SK, 2019) and Emergency Situation (Mimořádná událost, CZ, 2022).
- **Czech Television** released the fairy-tale **Krakonoš's Secret** (Krakonošovo tajemství, CZ/SK/DE, 2022, dir. Peter Bebjak).
- The Czech Magic Box released Identity Card (Občanský průkaz, CZ/SK, 2010, dir. Ondřej Trojan) a comedy about four friends coming of age in the 1970s, and a film adaptation of the well-known theatre play Midnight Mass (Polnočná omša) by Peter Karvaš, made in 1962 by director Jiří Krejčík. It was a special edition of the film for the 11th Noir Film Festival at Český Šternberk Castle.

Blu-ray

- The renowned British label **Second Run** released the digitally restored film **Dialogue 20-40-60** (Dialóg 20-40-60, CS, 1968, dir. Peter Solan, Zbyněk Brynych, Jerzy Skolimowski) as part of a 3BD set also containing Skolimowski's full-length films **Walkover** (Walkover, PL, 1965), **Barrier** (Bariera, PL, 1965) and four short films.
- In 2023, 19 DVDs or BDs with 19 Slovak and co-production audiovisual works were released. Of these, 13 DVDs and BDs contained full-length films for cinema (in 2022, 28 DVDs or BDs with 38 Slovak and co-production audiovisual works were released, of these 14 with full-length films for cinema).

- Slovak Films on VOD

- The **LUMIERE VOD** (http://lumierevod.obs.coe.int/) database which was launched on 16 April 2019 by the European Audiovisual Observatory, making it possible to search in more than **1,358 various VOD catalogues** in 46 European countries with **71,774 European films and 30,844 TV series** stated that in 2023, 719 Slovak films and 68 TV series were available in them. As for feature films, **Charlatan** (Šarlatán, CZ/IE/PL/SK, 2020, dir. Agnieszka Holland) was the most represented movie 85 catalogues in 20 countries and for TV series, it was **The Slavs** (Slovania, SK/UA, 2020, dir. Peter Bebjak, Michal Blaško, Serhii Sanin, Oleg Stahursky) 20 catalogues in 14 countries.
- According to its data, **Apple iTunes** was among the largest providers of Slovak audiovisual works with 193 full-length films and six series, **DAFilms** with 165 full-length and short films, **Voyo** with 117 full-length films and sixty series, **Netflix** with 73 full-length films, **HBO Max** with 71 full-length films and **Amazon Prime Video** with 54 full-length films and two short animated films.
- As many as 10 Slovak films were ranked in the Top 10 films of the week, according to viewer numbers, on Netflix. Three of them were even ranked first Never Say Never (Nikdy nehovor nikdy, SK/CZ, 2023, dir. Branislav Mišík), Villa Lucia (Villa Lucis, SK/CZ, 2023, dir. Michal Kollár) and twice Invalid (Invalid, SK, 2023, dir. Jonáš Karásek).
- According to JustWatch (www.justwatch.com/) research, the data showed that Netflix (28%) was the favourite streaming service in Slovakia in 2023. Amazon Prime Video (22%) ranked second, HBO Max (16%) third, VOYO (13%) fourth and Disney + (10%) fifth.

CINEMAS

- 2023 was the first year since 2019 to be without any epidemiological measures. It is gratifying that, according to our information, none of the cinemas has closed down as a result of the pandemic. This was also thanks to support from the Audiovisual Fund (AVF) and a one-off contribution of EUR 1 million from the Ministry of Culture of the Slovak Republic, which the AVF used to support cinema operators affected by the crisis situation as a result of the COVID-19 outbreak. In the context of the re-opening of cinemas, projects for alternative film performances in the online space have come to an end.
- In 2023, 176 commercial cinemas (i.e. cinemas where an admission fee was charged) with 295 screens were in operation (in 2022, there were 158 cinemas with 271 screens). Of these, 96 were single-screen cinemas with a total of 25,920 seats, 23 were miniplexes (cinemas with 2 to 7 screens) with 90 screens and 13,775 seats and 5 were multiplexes (cinemas with 8 to 24 screens) with 56 screens and 8,551 seats, 35 open-air cinemas with 28,017 seats, 11 alternative spaces with 12 screens and 570 seats, four itinerant cinemas and two drive-in cinemas with places for 145 cars.
- In addition, the IMAX cinema with a capacity of 468 viewers and IMAX 3D

technology has been in operation in Bratislava since 2015, although it is not included in the official European statistics.

- As in 2022, no new multi-screen cinema opened in 2023 in Slovakia. However, on 21 September 2023, **Cinema City Eurovea** was ceremoniously opened with 8 new screens that were added to the original cinema and better technological equipment (5x 3D, 1x Dolby Atmos, 8x laser projector).
- The 4-screen Cinema Lumière in Bratislava was closed after an exceptional event, a fire with devastating consequences that broke out on 20 September 2022 on the premises of the SFI's digitisation workplace in the building where Cinema Lumière is also located, and all projections were subsequently carried out in substitute premises. Following remediation of the premises and the subsequent planned refurbishment, Cinema LumiŽre only re-opened on 6 February 2024.
- Lúky Cinema in Bratislava with 196 seats was opened, digitised and modernised, on 9 February 2023.
- The Dominican Cultural Centre (DCC) Veritas in Košice started to regularly screen films on 29 October 2023.
- The renovated Dukla Cinema in Svidník was opened on 11 October 2023.
- Following a break in 2021 and 2022, Turiec Cinema in Turčianske Teplice renewed screenings on 18 October 2023 after moving into the renovated hall of the cultural centre.
- On 17 November 2023 the **TAJMS Cinema in Bánovce nad Bebravou** reopened; it had been closed since 1 July 2019.
- Commercial screenings were also resumed after two years in **Zora Cinema in Smolenice**.

- The Audiovisual Fund (AVF) has supported cinemas since 2010 in Programme 4 Development of Audiovisual Technologies in the Slovak Republic in five sub-programmes.
- 4.1 Digitisation of cinemas with D-Cinema technology in accordance with DCI standards;
- 4.2 Modernisation of cinemas with E-Cinema HD technology;
- 4.3 Modernisation of the equipment of digitised single-screen cinemas;
- 4.4 Development of technologies for the production of audiovisual works in the Slovak Republic;
- 4.5 Projects aimed at cinema marketing and audience development.
- At the outset, it was possible to only apply for cinema digitisation with D-Cinema technology in accordance with DCI standards; however, in 2013, the AVF also opened a new sub-programme enabling applicants to obtain a grant for cinema modernisation using the less expensive digital E-Cinema HD technology. And as the applications from most of the cinemas that were interested and had funds available for digitisation were already supported, in 2014, subprogramme 4.3 Modernisation of Equipment of Digitised Single-screen Cinemas was
- **4.3 Modernisation of Equipment of Digitised Single-screen Cinemas** was added. The cinemas mainly used the funds to replace seats, floors, screens, for promotion, marketing and the ticket reservation system.

- As of 31 December 2023, **219 screens in 95 cinemas and 6 open-air cinemas** were digitised with **D-cinema** technology (209 screens in 92 cinemas and 6 open-air cinemas in 2022 har Ole 107 digitised screens of these, 39 in single-screen cinemas **3D screening** was even possible.
- For details, refer to the table: Cinemas in Slovakia as of 31 December 2023 on pages 33.
- While 15 out of 146 screens in multi-screen cinemas (10.27%) were digitised with D-Cinema technology up to DCI standards without AVF's support, only nine out of 64 single-screen cinemas (13.43%) managed to do so – Bánovce nad Bebrayou (TAJMS Cinema), Bratislava (Klap Cinema – it has not screened

for the public since 2020), Bratislava (Film Europe Cinema), Dubnica nad Váhom (Lastovička Cinema), Martin (Moskva Cinema), Stropkov, Stupava (X Cinema – it was not in operation from 29 January 2017 and resumed screening of films from 1 February 2020 under the name Kultúrka Cinema), Šamorín (Tuli Cinema) and Ružomberok (Kultúra Cinema). The renovation of the open-air cinema in Košice was funded from the means earmarked for 2013 ECC projects and the DCl projector in the open-air cinema in Martin was funded by the city.

 Those cinemas that have been using digital technology the longest are now encountering technical problems and the need to re-digitise. The **re-digitisation** of Kultúra Cinema in Ružomberok was the first to be supported in 2015.

- As of 31 December 2023, there were **35 open-air cinemas** (31 in 2022) out of 207 in operation with an admission fee being charged. In addition to 6 open-air cinemas digitised with D-Cinema technology (Banská Bystrica, Galanta, Košice, Martin, Nové Zámky, Trnava), films were also digitally screened in a further 4 open-air cinemas. The open-air cinemas in Krupina, Pezinok, Podhájska and Senec loaned a projector from the local single-screen cinemas. Hence, as many as **28.57% of open-air cinemas used D-Cinema technology**.
- The share of open-air cinemas in total admissions was 2.27 %; the average admission per screening was 84.55 viewers, and the average admission fee EUR 3.40. In 2023, the best-attended open-air cinema was the open-air cinema in Košice.
- As regards open-air cinemas, Palo Bielik's Open-air Cinema in Banská Bystrica regularly screens films from 35 mm copies; in 2016, the original 70 mm projectors were also put into operation here.
- In 2023, the Orava Drive-in Cinema in Námestovo (capacity 65 cars) and the drive-in cinema in Ružomberok (capacity 80 cars) were in operation.

- And also four commercial itinerant cinemas the open-air Gamon Cinema, the Itinerant Cinema at the Orava Drive-in Cinema, the Zálesie Wandering Cinema and the open-air Úsvit Cinema in Betliar, just as several dozen further singlescreen cinemas and alternative spaces.
- As of 31 December 2023, **31 cinemas** in 19 cities (26 cinemas in 18 cities in 2022) formed part of the **European cinema** network, Europa Cinemas (3,160 screens in 38 countries and 786 cities). In 2023, **five further cinemas** DK Lúky in Bratislava, Star in Lučenec and Zvolen, Záhoran in Malacky and Kultúrka in Stupava **joined** the cinemas that were already members in the previous year Artkino Za zrkadlom, Film Europe Cinema, Mladosť, Nostalgia and Cinema Lumière (all in Bratislava), cinemas in Košice (Úsmev), Liptovský Mikuláš (Nicolaus), Piešťany (Fontána), Rimavská Sobota (Orbis), Ružomberok (Kultúra), Sereď (Nova), Spišská Nová Ves (Mier), Trenčín (Artkino Metro), CINEMAX miniplexes in Banská Bystrica, Dunajská Streda, Košice, Martin, Nitra, Poprad, Prešov, Skalica, Trenčín, Trnava (Aréna + MAX), Žilina and the CINEMAX multiplex in Bratislava.

> FILM CLUBS

- Film clubs in Slovakia are associated within the Association of Slovak Film Clubs (ASFC). As of 31 December 2023, there were a total of **51 film clubs with 1,262 members** (in 2022, 50 film clubs with 1,525 members). Most of the film clubs operate on the premises of conventional cinemas.
- As many as 131 films from the ASFC catalogue appeared in the programmes of cinemas. And the offer of the **VoD** online platform (Vimeo ASFC) was enlarged (to 41 titles – it was 17 in 2022).
- In 2023, 54,276 viewers attended screenings of art-house films in all cinemas in Slovakia (not only in film clubs), which represents a year-on-year increase of 8.39%. In 2023, art-house films constituted 1.08% (1.00% in 2022) of the total attendance at Slovak cinemas.
- Total attendance at Slovak cinemas in 2023 amounted to 5,017,476 viewers.
- The average admission fee was EUR 3.73 (EUR 2.79 in 2022) for art-house films in all cinemas. By way of comparison, the average admission fee per screening in all cinemas was EUR 6.90 in 2023.
- You can find the results of the 30th International Film Festival Febiofest Bratislava, organised by the Association of Slovak Film Clubs in association with the Slovak Film Institute, chapter on FESTIVALS. In 2023, no laureates were announced for the traditional ASFC Annual Awards.
- The Film Cabinet for Kids, which is primarily intended for teachers and pupils of grades 1 to 4 of primary schools, continued its activities.
- In 2023, the ASFC brought 31 new films to cinemas, of which 6 were re-re-leases films by Lars von Trier: Antichrist (DK/DE/FR/SE/IT, 2009), Manderlay (DK/SE/FR/GB/NL/DE, 2005), Melancholia (DK/SE/FR/DE, 2011), Dancer in the Dark (DK/FR/SE, 2000), Breaking the Waves (DK/SE/FR/NL, 1996) and The Idiots (Idioterne, DE/SE/DE/FR/NL/IT, 1998).
- And 3 animated short films that were screened prior to the main film: Money and Happiness (RS/SI/SK, 2022, dir. Ana Nedjelković, Nikola Majdak) prior to Ordinary Failures (Běžná selhání, CZ/HU/IT/SK, 2022, dir. Cristina Grosan); Criss Cross (Krížom krážom, SK/CZ, 2023, dir. Nina Rybárová, Tomáš Rybár) prior to Yuku and the Flower of the Himalayas (Yuku et la fleur de l'Himalaya, BE/FR, 2022, dir. Arnaud Demuynck, Rémi Durin) and Blue Teddy Bear (Plavi medo, HR/SK, 2023, dir. Marina Andree Škop) prior to Dounia and the Princess of Aleppo (Dounia et la princesse d'Alep, CA/FR, 2022, dir. André Kadi, Marya Zarif).
- The Whale (US, 2022, dir. Darren Aronofsky) became the best-attended arthouse film in 2023 with 6.166 viewers.

SLOVAK FILM INSTITUTE

- The Slovak Film Institute (SFI, https://sfu.sk/) is the sole state organisation in Slovakia in the area of audiovision which deals with film and cinematography as such in a comprehensive manner.
- It was established on 1 April 1963 in Bratislava and commemorated 60 years since its establishment in 2023.
- There are, in all, four basic sources of the SFI's budget the state contribution, revenues from its own activities, a contribution from the European Union for the activities of Creative Europe Desk Slovakia and, since 2012, the SFI may also apply for grants from the Audiovisual Fund (AVF).
- The total costs of the institution in 2023 amounted to EUR 6,466,250.16, with total revenues amounting to EUR 6,508,206.18, resulting in the institution's improved economic result of EUR 41,956.02. In view of the repeated budget cuts by the Ministry of Culture of the Slovak Republic (MC SR), the prerequisite for maintaining a balanced budget will continue to be maximum revenue from its own activities and significant savings in all areas.
- The SFI has been a member of the International Federation of Film Archives (FIAF) since 2001 and of European Film Promotion since 2006.
- The main tasks, activities and scope of the SFI are defined in **Act No. 40/2015 on Audiovision** and on Amendments and Supplements to certain Acts of 3 February 2015 with effect from 1 July 2015 ("Audiovisual Act").
- The principal tasks of the SFI include the storage, protection and restoration of the audiovisual heritage, its processing and enhancement, the development and distribution of knowledge in the field of audiovisual culture and, in particular, the cinematography and audiovisual art of the Slovak Republic. The basic activities include the professional storage, treatment, preservation and restoration of the audiovisual heritage, rendering the audiovisual heritage available to the public for study, educational and scientific purposes, searching for, obtaining, collecting, cataloguing and preserving originals or copies of audiovisual works and audiovisual recordings and making them available to the public, including documentary and informational materials relating to audiovisual works and audiovisual recordings, theoretical and conceptual, scientific, research, documentation, coordination, education, bibliographic, search, methodological and consulting activities and publishing activities, including the publishing of periodical and non-periodical publications and media with Slovak audiovisual works: the creation and operation of an information system, the operation of Cinema LumiŹre and the retail outlet Klapka, the organisation of cultural events, reviews and festivals, the promotion of audiovision and cinematography, including the promotion of the audiovisual heritage, fulfilling the role of the national filmoth Zque and collaboration with international organisations in the field of audiovision and cinematography, and representing the Slovak Republic in those organisations.
- The SFI exercises the copyrights for audiovisual works produced by public organisations operating in audiovision which exerted these rights on the basis of generally binding regulations effective prior to 1997. With regard to these works,

the SFI exercises the rights of authors and performing artists to artistic performances in such works; the SFI is the producer of their audiovisual recording and thereby enhances the property rights with its activities.

- The SFI exercises public administration in the area of protection of the audiovisual heritage, provides methodological guidance for cataloguing activities, protection and restoration of the audiovisual heritage and assesses the audiovisual value of audiovisual works, audiovisual recordings and audio recordings pursuant to Section 22 of the Audiovisual Act.
- The SFI maintains a list of Slovak audiovisual works pursuant to Section 3 of the Act and a list of persons operating in audiovision pursuant to Section 6 of the Act; it enforces the activities of information offices of the European Union and Council of Europe programmes for the support of audiovision, and for the performance of scientific and research activities.
- Pursuant to Section 23 of the Audiovisual Act, the SFI bodies are the General Director, the Council and the Audiovisual Heritage Commission.
- The National Film Archive (NFA) and the National Cinematographic Centre (NCC) are the basic organisational units.
- In accordance with the decision of the Slovak Ministry of the Interior, the National Film Archive (NFA) is a specialised public archive consisting of unique film and film-related archive funds and collections.
- The National Cinematographic Centre (NCC) is the umbrella organisation for the Audiovisual Information Centre, the Department of Film Events, the Publications Department, the Film.sk editorial office and the information offices of the EU and Council of Europe programmes.
- Its mission is to promote and present the Slovak audiovisual heritage, as well as current Slovak cinema, at domestic and international film forums, and to present it to both the Slovak and the world public. It organises and co-organises film events, it collaborates with partner organisations, coordinates the publishing of general promotional materials aimed at Slovak cinema and audiovision, it is responsible for the collation and provision of comprehensive information and services related to Slovak cinema, it initiates and co-organises working meetings of professionals at the international level and information-educational events for experts in cinematography/audiovision in Slovakia.
- The Audiovisual Information Centre (AIC) acts as an information centre for events encompassing audiovision in Slovakia and abroad. The AIC collates, processes and publishes the information which arrives at the Ministry of Culture or the SFI from the area of audiovision, and is intended for experts in Slovak cinema and audiovision. All up-to-date and relevant information is available on www.aic.sk, which also includes an online database of Upcoming Slovak Films (www.aic.sk/slovakfilms).
- Since 1 January 2014, the Creative Europe Desk Slovakia has been a specialised unit of the SFI. The role of the office is to provide for the dissemination of information on the Creative Europe Programme and to provide administrative

support for project promoters. Record support was awarded to Slovak entities in 2023 within the MEDIA Sub-programme.

(For more information, refer to the chapter on **MEDIA**.)

- Digitisation of audiovisual heritage forms an important activity of the SFI. The institution provides this activity at the digitisation workplace thanks to the Digital Audiovision national project, which the SFI has implemented since 2011 in association with Radio and Television of Slovakia. The digitisation workplace, which was built in 2013, constituted an important complex functional and systemic unit for the digitisation and digital restoration of film heritage with direct links to the entire process of preservation and making the audiovisual heritage of the Slovak Republic accessible. In September 2022, a fire broke out at the workplace with devastating consequences; the main objective of the institution is now to rebuild and renew the digitisation workplace activities in order to be able to carry out the digitisation of the audiovisual heritage of the Slovak Republic.
- In 2023, the long-term **Systematic Restoration of the Slovak Audiovisual Heritage Project** continued. It was first implemented in its current form in 2006 subsequent to approval by the Slovak Government, currently it has been approved as a long-term project with a view to 2033. The objective of the project is the systematic protection and gradual renewal of the audiovisual heritage collections primarily on film media, while maintaining the original quality that all archival norms and standards have to comply with. Amongst other aims, it focuses on the renewal and recovery of SFI film collections from tri-acetate and nitro-cellulose to polyester. The complete production of 35 mm film materials was performed in the Film Laboratories Zlín, a.s.
- The technologically most complicated area of work is the restoration of the full-length feature film fund; in 2023, 16 titles were fully restored from this fund.
 A total of 68 titles were restored from the collection of short and medium-length documentaries.
- **Presentation of Slovak Cinema Abroad** this project has been implemented by the National Cinematographic Centre since 2009. Its objective is to increase the extent and quality of the presentation of Slovak cinema and audiovision abroad and, at the same time, to contribute to rendering it more visible.
- The reduction in the institution's budget in 2023 and the cancellation of financial support for the presentation of Slovak cinema abroad for the years 2023-2025 by the MC SR resulted in a decline in the activities in the field of international presentation, although many of the activities have continued to be implemented. Slovak cinema was represented at the most important international festivals and forums, namely at the Berlin International Film Festival and Film Market, Cannes, Clermont-Ferrand and Karlovy Vary. Also significant was the screening of digitally restored films by Viktor Kubal on the occasion of the 100th anniversary of his birth at the Ghent Film Festival and the renewed Japanese première of the digitally restored film **Pictures of the Old World** (Obrazy starého sveta, CS, 1972) by Dušan Hanák, which was shown at 17 screenings in Japanese

prefectures. As for domestic events, the SFI organised the **Ukrainian Film Week**, which took place in Bratislava and Košice, the **Slovak Film Week** and the **Bratislava Industry Days**, an event for film professionals during the IFF Febiofest Bratislava.

- 2023 marked the 60th anniversary of the Slovak Film Institute's establishment. On this occasion, a number of events were held to commemorate this anniversary which included films from the collections of the Slovak Film Institute in their programme under the unified title 60 Years of the Slovak Film Institute. Slovak films were thus shown in significant numbers at the Art Film Fest IFF, IFF Febiofest Bratislava, Animation Fest Anča IFF, Cinematik IFF. There was also a screening in association with the National Film Archive Prague at Ponrepo Cinema, where four blocs of Slovak films from the Slovak Film Institute's collections were screened.
- In 2023, the SFI participated as an organiser, co-organiser or partner in **105** events in **34** countries and **10** domestic events. It also participated in the screening of 256 full-length and short classic and contemporary Slovak films. The most-screened film from the collections of the SFI was Dušan Hanák's documentary **Pictures of the Old World** (CS, 1972), followed by Jaroslav Siakel's Jánošík (Jánošík, CS, 1921) and Štefan Uher's **The Sun in a Net** (Slnko v sieti, CS, 1962). Among contemporary films, the most-screened were short films: Filip Diviak's **My Name is Edgar and I Have a Cow** (Volám sa Edgar a mám kravu, CZ/SK, 2023) and Daria Kashcheeva's **Electra** (CZ/FR/SK, 2023), while in the area of feature-length titles, **Photophobia** (Svetloplachosť, SK/CZ/UA, 2023) by Ivan Ostrochovský and Pavel Pekarčík, **The Visitors** (Návštevníci, CZ/NO/SK, 2022) by Veronika Lišková and **Tony, Shelly and the Magic Light** (Tonko, Slávka a kúzelné svetlo, CZ/SK/HU, 2023) by Filip Pošivač, dominated.
- Representing Slovakia in the Council of Europe's Cinema Support Fund, Eurimages, has been a part of the Presentation of Slovak Cinema Abroad project since 2014. (For more information, refer to the chapter on **EURIMAGES**.)
- The SK CINEMA Information System (project approved by the MC SR) by the end of 2023, the total number of recordings in the system achieved 674,031, which represents an increase of 28,521 recordings over the course of 2023. The SFI databases (Slovak Film Database, SFI Catalogue, SFI Thesaurus) are also available to the general public on the Internet via the SK CINEMA film portal at www.skcinema.sk. It is the most important, relevant, publicly available source of Slovak audiovision.
- The basic long-term task of the SFI in the upcoming period is performance of the tasks of maintaining a **statutory repository** of audiovisual works, the provision of comprehensive professional maintenance for the cinematographic section of the national cultural heritage of the Slovak Republic and, as part of this, in particular, the complete systematic rescue and restoration of its film collections, including their transcription to digital and magnetic media, the gradual di-

- gitisation of archive collections for the purposes of long-term storage and rendering them available via new media, the professional cataloguing of archive items and collections, the description of their content, and their subsequent availability to the public.
- The SFI has operated **Cinema Lumière** since September 2011. It is a member of the **Europa Cinemas** international network of cinemas. The cinema has four screening rooms which are digitised to DCI standards and, at the same time, have 35 mm projectors with the following capacities: K1 (195 seats), K2 (79 seats), K3 (36 seats) and K4 (44 seats). Screening room K3, entitled Filmothèque Study Screening Room of the SFI, screens mainly archived foreign and Slovak films and the films are predominantly projected on 35 mm copies.
- The fire at the SFI's digitisation workplace in the autumn of 2022 also significantly affected Cinema Lumière. The extent of the damage caused by the smoke in the cinema led to the decision to re-open the premises to the public only after the planned reconstruction had been completed. Cinema Lumière, which has become a modern space with greater visual and technological comfort following its reconstruction, welcomed its first visitors on 6 February 2024. **The reconstruction cost a total of EUR 2,438,000**, of which EUR 2,184,000 was spent on the construction works and EUR 254,000 on cinema technology.
- During the closure in 2023, Cinema Lumière held its screenings in three temporary venues: the cinema of the Film and Television Faculty of the Academy of Performing Arts (FTF VŠMU), the cinema of the Slovak National Gallery (SNG) and, in summer, it screened in the outdoor cinema in Nová Cvernovka under the name of Lumière under the Palm Tree.
- The key activities of the cinema last year included, in addition to its own screenings, the International Film Festival Febiofest Bratislava, the Slovak Film Week and the 10th KADU interdisciplinary educational seminar, which was devoted to the theme of Memory Archive Canon and commemorated the 60th anniversary of the founding of the Slovak Film Institute (SFI).
- The total **attendance at Cinema Lumière** in 2023 reached 18,495 viewers, with a total of 460 screenings, including events.
- The only **specialised film library** in Slovakia (16,760 books, 2,190 scripts and 2,542 archived volumes of periodicals) and a **mediathèque** (31,203 films, of these 5,624 are Slovak films) form part of the SFI.
- The SFI has issued Film.sk, the only monthly on film events in Slovakia, since 2000.
- The SFI's Publications Department issues the filmological magazine for science about film and moving images **Kino-Ikon**, which has been a professionally reviewed magazine since 2014, in collaboration with the Association of Slovak Film Clubs (ASFC).

- In 2023, the SFI's most important publication was Rodinné filmové striebro (Family Film Silver) which was issued on the occasion of the institution's 60th anniversary. It consists of short reflections and essays on selected, past and present works of our cinema by sixty well-known and lesser-known authors.
- The SFI also published the collection Jelena Paštéková Between Literature and Film (Jelena Paštéková medzi literatúrou a filmom, editor Martin Kaňuch) and Film and Its Double (Film a jeho dvojník) which presents a collection of texts by the French filmmaker and writer Alain Robbe-Grillet.
- The SFI also participated in the issuance of the photographic publication The Real Real in the Photographic Portraits of Miro Nôta (Reálne reálno vo fotografických portrétoch Mira Nôtu) in association with OZ Fotofo and the collection PIŠTA on the works of Peter Pišťanek, compiled by Václav Macek and Zuzana Goleinová, which is the output of a seminar held in 2022 as part of the Slovak Film Week. A collection of texts from the Slovak Film Week event entitled Slovak Film in 2022 (Slovenský film v roku 2022) has been published electronically.
- In 2023, at the 34th Igric Awards, the SFI was awarded the Special Prize for Creativity for Audiovisual Theory and Critique for its book **Alphabet of Slovak Cinema 1921 - 2021** (Abecedár slovenského filmu 1921 - 2021).
- In 2023, the SFI continued to make domestic film production accessible. Following its 60th anniversary, in the second half of 2023 it released **five titles from its 6-part Blu-ray collection** with important Slovak films **The Organ** (Organ, CS, 1964) by Štefan Uher, **A Case for the Defence Attorney** (Prípad pre obhajcu, CS, 1964) by Martin Hollý, **The Song of the Grey Pigeon** (Pieseň o sivom holubovi, CS, 1961) by Stanislav Barabáš, **The Boxer and Death** (Boxer a smrť, CS, 1962) by Peter Solan and **The Prime of Life** (Kristove roky, CS, 1967) by Juraj Jakubisko; a Blu-ray disc featuring Dušan Hanák's **Pictures of the Old World** (Obrazy starého sveta, CS, 1972) will be released in 2024. The digitally restored film **Dialogue 20-40-60** (Dialóg 20-40-60, CS, 1968, dir. Peter Solan, Zbyněk Brynych, Jerzy Skolimowski) has been released on Blu-ray by the well-known British label Second Run as part of a 3 BD box set also containing other Skolimowski films. (For more details, refer to the chapter on **VIDEODISTRIBUTION**.)
- From 2017, the SFI has held the qualification certificate for the performance of research and development. The SFI's scientific-research activities are guaranteed and coordinated by the SFI's Scientific and Publications Board.
- The SFI's outlet Klapka.sk offers a wide assortment of filmological literature, CDs and DVDs and other film materials. The best-selling titles produced by the SFI were: the DVD with The Millennial Bee (Tisícročná včela, SK, 1983) by director Juraj Jakubisko, the Blu-ray with The Garden (Záhrada, SK/FR/CZ, 1995) by director Martin Šulík; as for publications, shoppers were mostly interested in the book Alphabet of Slovak Cinema 1921–2021.

- Concluding licence agreements for Slovak films from the SFI collections is one of the SFI's basic activities. TOP films (fairy tales and the most watched films) have been licensed since 2017 by means of a public tender.
- In 2023, 24 films were successful in three calls, the licences for the films were sold to RTVS, TV Markíza and TV JOJ. Cooperation with Czech Television and the Czechoslovak Film Company (CS Film) continued in the area of enhancement of property rights to Slovak films. The broadcasting of the weekly **Week in Film** on TA3 continued, and the SFI also provided excerpts for TV Markíza news and current affairs programmes and for 19 new audiovisual works. The most frequently watched film from the SFI's offer on Slovak television channels in 2023 was Juraj Jakubisko's **Lady Winter** (Perinbaba, CS/DE/IT/AT, 1985).
- All in all (including the public tender), the rights to television broadcasting of 82 Slovak films were commercially enhanced.
- In recent years, there has been a significant increase in interest in the release of films from the SFI's collections on **VoD and streaming platforms**, with a total of 45 cinematographic works licensed last year. SFI's full-length and short films are, for instance, available on DAFilms, Voyo, JOJ play, KVIFF.TV, Netflix and other platforms. Juraj Jakubisko's **Lady Winter** was the most viewed on Voyo and JOJ play.
- The presentation of six classic Slovak films from SFI's collections and two short Making of... films entitled **The Golden Era of Slovak Cinema** (Zlatá éra slovenskej kinematografie) continued on the French VOD portal La Cinetek combined with brief lecture video introductions in French and English. (For more details, refer to the chapters on **VIDEODISTRIBUTION** and **TELEVISION**.)
- In 2023, the SFI entered two projects as a co-production partner: The Truth is All There Is (Pravda je to najdôležitejšie, SK, 2023, dir. Maroš Brázda) about Eduard Grečner and Emília (Emília, SK, 2023, dir. Martin Šulík) about actress Emília Vášáryová.
- As of 31 December 2023, the SFI had archived basic Slovak films with a total length of 4,196,293 metres (the length of the individual works and fragments expressed in metres of film material). The total length of all types of film materials of Slovak works the SFI has archived in its collections is 26,945,973 metres of film material on 78,911 reels.

> TELEVISION

- The Slovak television broadcasters' share of the viewing audiences has slightly increased year-on-year. In 2023, Radio and Television of Slovakia (RTVS) with its channels (Jednotka, Dvojka, Šport and :24) and private broadcasters TV Markíza, DOMA, DAJTO, Markíza Krimi, TV JOJ, Plus, WAU, JOJko, JOJ 24, JOJ Svet, JOJ Šport and TA3 had a 62.6% daytime share (58.5% in 2022) and 69.0% for prime time (66.5% in 2022).
- All the results in this chapter concern the target group Ind 12+ Guests and it is Live + TSO-3 broadcasting, which means that the 3-day time shift is also taken into account.
- According to the Media Services Council (https://rpms.sk), as of 24 April 2024, there were 164 valid licences for television programme services broadcasting.
- **The list of on-demand audiovisual media services** falling under the scope of Act no. 308/2000 on Broadcasting and Retransmission as of 22 May 2024, there were **177 companies** registered (some of them several times).
- As of 20 March 2024, the Council received 75 notifications from natural persons providing on-demand audiovisual media services.
- As of 24 April 2024, there were also 136 registered retransmission licence-holders, of these, 117 licences were for providing retransmission in cable distribution networks (KDS, DVB-C, IPTV), 6 via the MMDS system, 2 via the MVDS system, 3 via the GSM and UMTS and 8 via DVB-T and DVB-S/DTH (satellite) transmitters.
- And on 6 July 2023 one video sharing platform (N I K É, spol. s r. o.) was granted a licence.
- $\ln 2023$, Markíza was the market leader with a daytime audience share of 16.0% and 19.0% for prime time (19.00 22.00). (For more rating details, refer to the table on page 52.)
- Radio and Television of Slovakia (RTVS), established by law as of 1 January 2011 (Act no. 532/2010 on Radio and Television of Slovakia and the Amendment and Supplementation of Certain Acts), is a public, national, independent, informative, cultural and educational institution that provides public service in the area of radio and television broadcasting and performs its activities mainly through its organisational units, which are Slovak Radio and Slovak Television. In 2023, Slovak Television broadcast on four channels Jednotka, Dvojka, Šport and :24.
- On 24 April 2024, the Government of the Slovak Republic adopted the Act on Slovak Television and Radio (STVR). By adoption in the National Council of the Slovak Republic, Radio and Television of Slovakia (RTVS) will cease to exist.
- Jednotka in 2023, cinematographic works, TV series of domestic and foreign origin, entertainment, but also sports constituted the basis of its programme structure.

- The daytime audience share was 10.7% and 12.7% for prime time. **Three Golden Ducats** (Tri zlaté dukáty, SK/CZ, 2023, dir. Mariana Čengel Solčanská) broadcast on 24 December 2023 achieved the highest rating (19.9%).
- Dvojka its broadcasting was directed towards minority, demanding audiences and specific target groups, Slovak regions and national minorities.
- The daytime market share of Dvojka was 1.8% and 1.6% for prime time. The 2023/2024 Champions League / Europa League / Europa Conference League Football Preliminaries broadcast on 31 August 2023 achieved the highest rating (3.5%).
- :24 in the emergency situation related to the war in Ukraine, from 6:00 a.m. on 28 February 2022 Trojka's broadcasting was replaced by full-fledged all-day news coverage of topics from home and around the world, supplemented by journalistic, documentary, educational, discussion and other programmes.
- The daytime audience share of :24 was 1.2% and 1.0% for prime time. **5 Minutes to 12** (0 5 minút 12, SK, 2023) broadcast on 1 October 2023 achieved the highest rating (4.2%).
- Sport a sports channel broadcasting for 24 hours a day programmes such as live broadcasts, sports news, healthy lifestyle magazines and archive materials. Broadcasting started on 20 December 2021.
- The daytime audience share of Šport was 1.8% and 2.2% for prime time.
- The broadcast of the hockey match Slovakia Switzerland at the 2023 Ice Hockey World Championship achieved the highest rating (21.2%).
- RTVS was the co-producer of **19 full-length films for cinemas, i.e. 41.3% of the 2023 production.** Of these, <u>8 were feature films</u> (10 in 2022) **Réveillon** (A máme, čo sme chceli, SK/CA, 2023, dir. Michal Kunes Kováč), **Invalid** (Invalid, SK, 2023, dir. Jonáš Karásek), **Mimi** (Mimi, SK, 2023, dir. Mira Fornay), **Power** (Moc, SK/HU/CZ, 2023, dir. Mátyás Prikler), **Photophobia** (Svetloplachosť, SK/CZ/UA, 2023, dir. Ivan Ostrochovský, Pavol Pekarčík), **Waltzing Matylda** (Tancuj Matyldo, CZ/SK, 2023, dir. Petr Slavík), **We Have Never Been Modern** (Úsvit, SK/CZ, 2023, dir. Matej Chlupáček) and **Zenith** (Zenit, SK/HU/CZ, 2023, dir. György Kristóf);
- 9 documentaries (13 in 2022) Andy Warhol The American Dream (Andy Warhol americký sen, SK, 2023, dir. Ľubomír Ján Slivka), Emília (Emília, SK, 2023, dir. - MARKÍZA SLOVAKIA, spol. s r.o. is operating four TV channels (Markíza, Doma, Dajto and Markíza Krimi) and also Markíza International, broadcasting in the Czech Republic.
- In 2023, Markíza was first as regards both daytime and prime-time audience shares. Drama programmes, entertainment and news and journalistic programmes were those mostly represented within its programme structure.
- In 2023, Markíza produced, for instance, 20 episodes of the first and second seasons and fifteen episodes of the third and fourth seasons each of the period romantic series **Dunaj**, at **Your Service** (Dunaj, k vašim službám, SK, 2023, dir. Peter Magát, Peter Kelíšek, Peter Hoferica) and its Christmas Special. The series begins in 1939 when Dunaj a new department store in Slovakia, opens its gates and becomes a symbol of modern times and, at the same time, the Slovak State is proclaimed.
- Markíza further produced 12 episodes of the drama series **The Lie** (Klamstvo, SK, 2023, dir. Braňo Mišík), 109 episodes of season 1 and 70 episodes of season 2 of the rom-com series **Mum for Rent** (Mam na prenájom, SK, 2023, dir. Matúš Libovič, Miloslav Volný, Roman Valentko) and **Mum for Rent Christmas Special**, 12 episodes of season 5 of the family comedy series **Mr. Professor** (Pán professor, SK, 2023, dir. Zuzana Marianková, Ondrej Hraška) and its Christmas Special.
- Five episodes of the fantasy series The Psychic (Vědma, CZ/SK, 2023, dir. Jakub Kroner) and two 8-episode seasons of the football documentary series To Heaven and Hell (Do neba a do pekla) entitled Spartak Trnava and Žilina Generation (Generácia Žilina, SK, 2023, dir. Marek Prochác) were produced for the streaming service Voyo.
- In 2023, the daytime audience share of TV Markíza was 16.0% and 19.0 % for prime time. The first female stand-up special in Slovakia, **Simona: The Full Monty!** (Simona: Donaha!, SK, 2022, dir. Lukáš Zednikovič) broadcast on 31 December 2023 achieved the highest rating (14.8%) on TV Markíza in 2023.
- DOMA is a TV channel belonging to the broadcaster MARKÍZA SLOVAKIA, spol. s r. o. profiled primarily for viewers preferring content focused on emotions, love and human relations. It has been broadcasting since 31 August 2009. Romantic TV series and films predominated in its programme structure, which was also enriched by premiŽre cooking programmes and the best from an ample archive of original production.
- In 2023, its daytime audience share was 3.0% and 2.4% for prime time. **Heaven Is for Real** (US, 2014, dir. Randall Wallace) broadcast on 27 December 2023 achieved the highest rating (2.9%).
- **DAJTO** is the third channel belonging to broadcaster MARKÍZA SLOVAKIA, spol. s r.o. It offers action, adventure and adrenaline films and TV series, cult sitcoms and attractive sports events. It started broadcasting on 20 August 2012.
- In 2023, the TV channel Dajto recorded a daytime audience share of 3.2%

and 3.2% for prime time. The second half of the Fortuna League football match **FC DAC 1904 Dunajská Streda – SC Slovan Bratislava** broadcast on 7 May 2023 achieved the highest rating (4.5 %).

- **Markíza Krimi** is the youngest linear TV channel in the portfolio of the Markíza Group. It started broadcasting on 6 June 2022. Its programme offer consists mainly of crime series and films, but also attractive news.
- In 2023, its daytime audience share was 2.5% and 1.9% for prime time. Episode 20 of season 7 of the crime series **The Specialists** (Specialisté, CZ, 2017– 2024, dir. various) entitled **The Bend** (Zatáčka, CZ, 2023, dir. Peter Magát) broadcast on 29 December 2023 achieved the highest rating (2.9%).
- Slovenská produkčná, a.s. is the parent of several companies holding licences for the TV channels of the JOJ Group. The JOJ Group has the biggest reach, as it provides the most domestic content, film titles and news programmes to audiences across its entire portfolio of 14 TV channels and a streaming platform, over 50 online portals owned by the JOJ Group and its partners and, moreover, has strong and successful communication on social networks.
- **TV JOJ** is nowadays the **sole full-format commercial TV channel** in Slovakia **available to all viewers**. It started broadcasting on 2 March 2002.
- In 2023, Slovenská produkčná co-produced two full-length feature films for cinemas – **Perinbaba: Two Realms** (Perinbaba a dva svety, SK/CZ, 2023, dir. Juraj Jakubisko) and **Villa Lucia** (Villa Lucia, SK/CZ, 2023, dir. Michal Kollár).
- In 2023, TV JOJ supported the production of several feature-length films for cinemas: How to Survive Your Love (Jak přežít svého muže, CZ, 2023, dir. Rudolf Merkner), Her Body (Její tělo, CZ/SK, 2023, dir. Natálie Císařovská), Big Dreams (Děti Nagana, CZ, 2023, dir. Dan Pánek), Never Say Never (Nikdy nehovor nikdy, SK/CZ, 2023, dir. Braňo Mišík).
- Last year, TV JOJ produced 10 episodes of the extremely successful TV series Iveta (Iveta, SK, 2023, Jan Hřebejk), 6 episodes of the new co-production TV series On the Waves of the Adriatic (Na vlnách Jadranu, SK, 2023, dir. Vojtěch Moravec), 8 episodes of the licenced TV series Call My Agent (Vytoč môjho agenta, SK, 2023, dir. Michal Blaško, Jakub Machala) and 10 episodes of the exotic new series **Love in Istanbul** (Lásky v Istanbule, SK, 2023, dir. Ivan Holub), 26 episodes of the comedy series **Web Therapy** (Weboyá terapia, SK, 2023, dir. Eduard Kudláč), 8 episodes of the mystery crime series **The Hunter** (Lovec, SK, 2023, dir. Jiří Strach) and also 8 episodes of the crime series **Ghost** (Duch, SK, 2023, dir. Matúš Ryšan, Róbert Šveda, Peter Bebjak). The popular series **The Ho**spital (Nemocnica, SK, 2023, dir. Jan Novák) got 3 new seasons last year - 7, 8 and 9, the comedy series The Border (Hranica, SK 2023, dir. Ján Novák, Ivan Predmerský, Richard Bobek) got seasons 2 and 3, and TV JOJ also made seasons 1 and 2 of the comedy series **Tomáš and Diana** (Tomáš a Diana, SK, 2023, dir. Michal Vajdička) as well as the one-hour special Tomáš and Diana at Christmas (Tomáš a Diana na Vianoce, SK, 2023, dir. Michal Vajdička).
- In addition to TV series, TV JOJ also produced new episodes of its shows and

programmes in 2023. In the Seventh Heaven (V siedmom nebi, dir. Peter Núňez), season 11 of Czechia Slovakia's Got Talent (Česko Slovensko má talent, dir. Jeffo Minařík), season 6 of Come Dine with Me (dir. Tomáš Eibner), season 10 of Incognito (Inkognito, dir. Tomáš Eibner), season 8 of Shopping Queen (Nákupné maniačky, dir. Ľudmila Lenárová), season 2 of Jeopardy (Riskuj!, dir. Peter Baláž), season 1 of Password (Heslo, dir. Rado Štefanov), season 6 of Our Pets (Miláčikovo, dir. Jana Pirohová), season 17 of New Living (Nové bývanie, creators: Kristína Cibulková, Roman Bünger, Vlado Voštinár) and season 8 of Dream Cottages (Na chalupa, dir. Peter Kaštíl). Season 9 of New Garden (Nová záhrada) was produced by TV JOJ and AWIS.

- JOJ Svet on 15 August 2023 JOJ Group started broadcasting its 14th TV channel JOJ Svet. It also started producing its own documentaries for this channel: 6 episodes of Hitler's Secret Missions (Hitlerove tajné misie, 2023) and 8 episodes of Alien Files (2023).
- In 2023, the daytime audience share of TV JOJ was 12.8% and 17.5% for prime time.
- Episode 1 of the TV series **Iveta** (Iveta, CZ, 2022–2024, dir. Jan Hřebejk) broadcast on 8 January 2023 achieved the highest rating (18.7%).

JOJ PLUS - the second channel from the JOJ Group portfolio has been broadcasting since 5 October 2008 and offers mainly films.

- Its daytime audience share in 2023 was 2.9% and 2.7% for prime time.
- **RED** (US, 2010, dir. Robert Schwentke) broadcast on 6 January 2023 achieved the highest rating (3.3%).
- WAU the third channel from the JOJ Group portfolio started broadcasting on 15 April 2013 and is focused primarily on broadcasting acquisition TV series. In 2023, its daytime audience share was 3.2% and 2.4% for prime time. Episode 15 of season 7 of the TV series Castle (US, 2009–2016, dir. various) entitled Reckoning (US, 2014, dir. Rob Bowman) broadcast on 1 February 2023 achieved the highest rating (2.7%).
- The JOJ Group offers Slovak audiences as many as two TV channels broadcasting programmes for children in Slovak language as the only media group on the market.
- JOJko replaced RiK on 1 January 2020. This children's channel offers fairy tales in Slovak language to the youngest audiences.
- In 2023, its daytime audience share was 0.2% and 0.1% for prime time. The episode of the animated series **Space Ranger Roger** (US, 2017, dir. Gilly Fogg, Larry Jacobs) broadcast on 6 January 2023 achieved the highest rating (0.4%). **Tuki TV** the fifth channel belonging to the JOJ Group and the second channel for children broadcasts programmes for young audiences aged 3 to 10 years exclusively in Slovak language and is available for customers of only one Slovak operator (Slovak Telekom).
- It has been in operation from 1 June 2015. Audience share data are not available.

- JOJ Cinema the sixth channel from the JOJ Group portfolio, commenced broadcasting on 1June 2015. The channel broadcasts films on the basis of a Czech licence; the channel's acquisition content has been legally endorsed for the territory of the Czech and Slovak Republics. Audience share data are not available.
- JOJ Family the seventh channel belonging to the JOJ Group and the second channel of the JOJ Group operating in the Czech Republic. It launched on 5 September 2016. It is a Slovak multi-genre family TV channel for Czech viewers and Slovaks living in the Czech Republic. It offers the best of the original programmes of the parent TV JOJ, acquisition and Czech films and TV series.
- In 2019, the JOJ Group extended its portfolio in the Czech Republic when it became owner of the Czechoslovak Film Company and its channels – entitled CS Film, CS Mystery, CS Horror and CS History after rebranding them.
- JOJ Šport the twelfth channel from the JOJ Group portfolio, commenced broadcasting on 6 October 2021. It broadcasts live coverage, sports news and journalistic programmes 24 hours a day.
- In 2023, its daytime audience share was 0.1% and 0.04% for prime time. The **2024 IIHF World Junior Championship** broadcast on 31 December 2023 achieved the highest rating (11.1%).
- JOJ 24 the thirteenth channel from the JOJ Group portfolio, commenced broadcasting on 2 October 2022. The programme consists of 80% news and 20% journalism.
- In 2023, its daytime audience share was 1.0% and 1.1% for prime time.
 KRIMI news broadcast on 3 September 2023 achieved the highest rating (2.4%).
- JOJ Svet the fourteenth channel from the JOJ Group portfolio commenced broadcasting on 15 August 2023 and it offers not only a selection of acquisition but also original Slovak and international documentaries in Slovak language.
- Its daytime audience share for less than half of 2023 was 0.01% and 0.01% for prime time. The episode of the documentary series Fishing the Wild (US, 2022), entitled Hebredian Island Scallops, broadcast on 28 December 2023 achieved the highest rating (0.4%).
- In addition to their own TV channels, the JOJ Group also has representation of foreign channels in our market in their commercial portfolio; currently these are Prima Plus and Prima Cool SK of the Czech broadcaster FTV Prima. As well as the TV channels making up the JOJ brand, there are also online websites, the news portal Noviny.sk, the TV JOJ mobile application and the JOJ play streaming platform. The JOJ Group also joins forces with the most important players in the online market in the field of video content creation in the VALETIN partnership platform, which brings together and offers video inventory on more than 50 online portals.
- In 2023, the audience share data of NOVA International, Prima PLUS, Minimax, Spektrum, Film+ and Senzi were available for the third time.
- **Nova International** the eighth channel of TV Nova for broadcasting abroad. It commenced broadcasting on 1 February 2016. The channel focuses on TV Nova's own programmes which have broadcasting rights in Slovakia.

Its daytime audience share in 2023 increased to 1.0% and 1.0% for prime time. The episode of the TV series **The Specialists** (Specialisté, CZ, 2017–2014) broadcast on 23 October 2023 achieved the highest rating (2.7%).

- **Prima Plus** TV channel of the FTV Prima Group with broadcasts directed to the territory of Slovakia. Prima Plus started broadcasting in Slovakia on 23 January 2017. The programme is mainly made up of Prima's own productions TV series, news programmes, entertainment shows, cooking and hobby programmes.
- Its audience share in 2023 was the same as in 2022 0.9% for daytime and 0.8% for prime time. The episode of season 5 of the TV series **The Cop** (Polda, CZ, 2016 2024, dir. Jaroslav Fruit) broadcast on 25 February 2023 achieved the highest rating (2.2%).
- Film+ Czech television station of the Luxembourg-based RTL Group, which
 operates several thematic stations in the CEE region. It focuses on films and broadcasts 24 hours a day. The channel is available with most cable companies and
 satellite platforms. Since 15 September 2003, it has been broadcasting in Slovakia, the Czech Republic, Serbia, Romania, Croatia and Hungary.
- In 2023, its daytime audience share was 0.6% and 0.5% for prime time. Kill Bill Vol.1 (US, 2003, dir. Quentin Tarantino) broadcast on 25 December 2023 achieved the highest rating (0.9%).
- Minimax Central European TV channel operated by Chello (formerly Minimax Media). It focuses on children's animated series. It has been broadcasting in Slovakia since 2003.
- Its daytime audience share in 2023 was 0.0% and 0.0% for prime time. Episode 5 of season 1 of the TV series The Owl & Co (La Chouette & Cie, 2013, FR, dir. Victor-Emmanuel Moulin, Jerome Houlier) broadcast on 1 January 2023 achieved the highest rating (0.2%).
- Senzi TV Slovak music TV channel and formerly the fourth channel of the JOJ Group. It was launched on 1 September 2013. SENZI, a. s. as the channel's service company was sold on 10 October 2015 to Nunez NFE. In 2016, the channel changed its broadcaster from MAC TV s.r.o. to McBoxs d.o.o. and was relocated from the JOJ Group to Music Box TV. It brings music production of many different genres.
- Its daytime audience share in 2023 was the same as in 2022 0.5% and 0.5% for prime time.
- TA3 is a news television channel which offers a comprehensive news and information service on events at home and abroad. Its signal is distributed in Slovakia through most of the cable distribution systems and it covers the entire territory of Slovakia via satellite. TA3 continued broadcasting the historical newscast Week in Film (Týždeň vo filme) in association with the SFI.
- In 2023, its daytime audience share was 2.2% and 1.2% for prime time. The
 2023 Elections (Voľby 2023) broadcast on 1 October 2023 achieved the highest rating (6.2%).

- TV Lux is a Catholic TV channel, the outcome of a collaboration between the Episcopal Conference of Slovakia and LUX Communication. It offers programmes in compliance with the doctrine and life of the Catholic church. Its aim is to provide people with the opportunity to learn about and grow within their faith, thereby deriving strength in their daily lives.
- Audience share data are not available.
- **Mall.tv** (https://sk.mall.tv) is an Internet television which commenced broadcasting on 16 September 2019. It is available free of charge. On 1 April 2023 it was renamed to **Fameplay.tv** (https://sk.fameplay.tv/).
- HBO produced the TV series The Winner (Víťaz, SK, 2023, dir. Jan Hřebejk). Eventually, it was never broadcast on its platforms because it sold the rights to SkyShowtime. It is its first original Slovak series, made in collaboration with Czech filmmakers and actors. This family comedy series follows the life of Viktor Hudák, played by Ady Hajdu the former Prime Minister of a small European country.

- The latest edition of the Sun in a Net 2024 National Film Awards also included, for the second time, entries in the Best TV Film/Miniseries/TV Series category. The following films and TV series applied: the TV film Three Golden Ducats (Tri zlaté dukáty, SK/CZ, 2023, dir. Mariana Čengel Solčanská) premièred on 24 December 2023, the TV series Dunaj, at Your Service (Dunaj, k vašim službám, SK, 2023, Peter Magát, Peter Kelíšek, Peter Hoferica) premièred on 1 January 2023, The Psychic (Vědma, CZ/SK, 2023, dir. Jakub Kroner) premièred on 16 June 2023, and the television miniseries Mathematics of Crime (Matematika zločinu, CZ/SK, 2023, dir. Peter Bebjak) premièred on 27 July 2023. The Psychic did not receive a nomination and Mathematics of Crime became the winner in this category.
